
HM Stationery Office (Hurlin Die) contd.

It is characterised by а type, a hole the 'M', but otherwise similar missing in is verv to No. 5 (as illustrated 5 of Bulletin 213) on page so its correct number may be Mr. M. Werner 5a. sent us photocopies of examples from his collection. Two of these four are new variations, numbered 10 and 11 below.
