Swift & Company perfin pattern S2-34 was used on this cover which really got the works. Mailed from Chicago, IL on August 2, 1920 it was sent to London (August 17) and finally France with a

French 10 centimes postage due (not clear) it was returned and had a U.S. bar precancel postage due on it. Since "Refused" is written in English, I think that we may assume Swift and Company did not want it back.

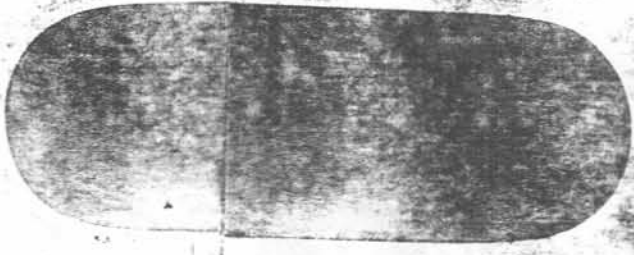
