

## More Holes in Bosnia

Notes: For BH 5 and 12, I used the information from Donaupost 1935, although other names are circulating (between brackets). In some cases no patterns are available, but are known to exist.

The first Perfins were used by the 'Landesbank' (November 1895) and the transport company Schmarda, Rotter and Perschitz (March 1896). So these Perfins are much more common on the typographed set in the type II and III (5 Kreutzer only), than on lithographed stamps. The latter ones are scarce.

Bosnian perfins are very difficult to find on cover, which is really the only way to prove origin. The following BH-numbers are fond on cover: BH 3, 4, 13, 14, 16 and 19 (figure 5).

The Michel (or Ferchenbauer) catalog numbers in table 2 are used like 34-36 means that number 33 is included. In some cases the catalogue number isn't known (x).


