
Is Ruling No. 2159 in fact positive ID for F104?

Shown above are the front and rear of a post card mailed July 26, 1920 in Philadelphia, PA. The message headed "Ruling 2159" is simply a dues receipt from the Fraternal Mystic Circle. The perfin makes this item of greater interest than usual. It is perfin pattern F104 (FMC) user unidentified in *The Catalog of United States Perfins*.

The back of this card clearly identifies the user as the Fraternal Mystic Circle, F.M.C. Building, 1913 Arch Street, Philadelphia. The initials, FMC, match the user letter by letter.
