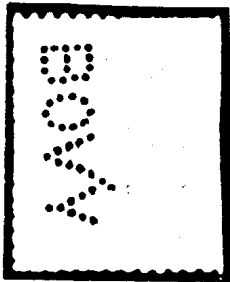


ANOTHER BOUNDARY!
