NEWSPAPER WRAPPERS OF KEVII and KGV

This third article on Perforated Postal Stationery deals with the Newspaper Wrappers of KEVII and KGV. There are two different pre-printed stamps on the News Wrappers of KEVII and two on the Wrappers of KGV. All types have sub-divisions of shades, issued at various times, but for the purposes of this research I shall record dies under the one shade/value.

A 'J' in the 'Latest' column denotes a reporting seen in Jennings's book. +J or +C denotes reported by members as well.

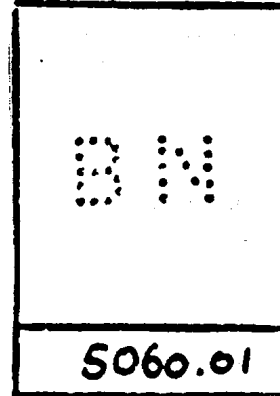
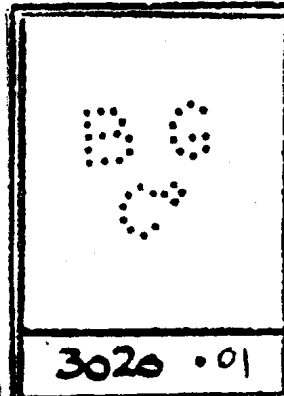
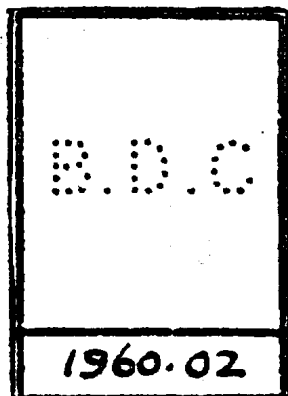
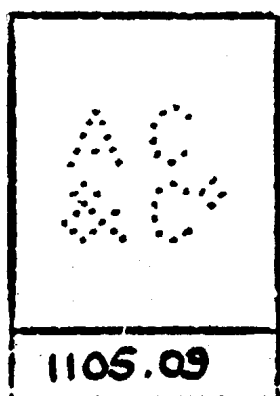
