The instructions were scribbled out when another "RT/£C" die was made/used. See R5240.01d in use 1941-1943.

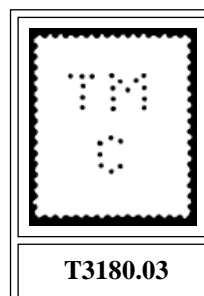

This die, T3100.03 and U0360.01a below, along with C7700.02 and J0330.02 from the New Identity list issued with B451 (Aug 2024) have no stamp details, and are considered as (extremely rare) 'missing links'.

**Note - This is NOT a New Die.**

Although currently no stamp details are known, this die would be a natural follow on from "JP/S" (J6210.01), in use 1912-1939. J6210.04 has all the characteristics of a die made by J Sloper & Co as a result of their pre-WWII refurbishment programme, and would have been destroyed in the "Blitz" on Sloper's Budge Row Works on the night of 10<sup>th</sup> May 1941.



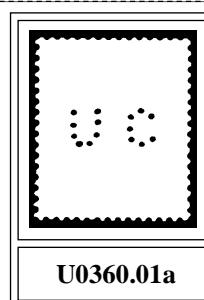

Although currently no stamp details are known, this die would be a natural follow on from "TM/C" (T3180.04), in use 1920-1939. T3180.03 has all the characteristics of a die made by J Sloper & Co as a result of their pre-WWII refurbishment programme, and would have been destroyed in the "Blitz" on Sloper's Budge Row Works on the night of 10<sup>th</sup> May 1941.

U0360.01a has all the characteristics of a die made by J Sloper & Co as a result of their pre-WWII refurbishment programme, and would have been destroyed in the "Blitz" on Sloper's Budge Row Works on the night of 10<sup>th</sup> May 1941.
