Counting the Catalogs

One of the first things I did when I took over the Bulletin this time was look at my collection – of catalogs. I feel that I can neither write nor edit efficiently without current information on the subject and thus current catalogs are essential.

The first product of this work was the publication of the lists of citations of the current catalogs (PB 56: 85-87, 96-97; & 57:14-15). The first list was mine, the next two were corrections and additions made by members with more current information than mine.

I had planned to begin (in fact I announced in January that I would begin) the list I have put together of world perfin counts based on these catalogs, rather than the census we periodically hold. But then, Bob Schwertdt submitted his 'top 25' list from the most recent Club census and it was too good a lead to pass up. So, in February I published that list. And, this month he has sent a list from Robert Dedecker that I will include as part of this introduction to my count the catalog listing. Robert's list is a set of estimates for totals in the various country catalogs (unspecified). It is as follows:

And Mr. Dedecker gives an estimate of about 61,000 different dies for a "top" collection.

So, with these two different summaries as a perfect lead-in, I will begin the counting of the catalogs.

I began my listing with the last world census listing. However, I rapidly abandoned the empire unit format in favor of a purely alphabetic listing. I also had to resolve a few naming problems (different people using different names for apparently the same geographic unit [one good example is Levant – and its various other names]). Where names were an issue the "catalog" column in hte listing will contain a "see... "-note and no counts will be given for that name.

I have addressed a major concern expressed by several collectors with respect to the listing of current catalogs. Each country/territory name is followed by the author and date of the catalog which has been counted. Refer back to the Bulletins referenced above in this article for a full citation for each.

The remaining columns are POST (a count of patterns in Postage stamps), REV (a count of patterns in revenue stamps), SPEC (specimen punches reported for that country/territory), OTH (count of Other issues – often separate count of officials, postal stationery items, frauulent punches, or cinderellas.), and Comments (just that – though used somewhat inconsistently.. sorry). Inconsistancies in cataloging do exist. Several catalogs do not distinguish POST from REV, others dion't distinguish OTH items. Cvounts reflect what I could figure out from the catalogs – I don't speculate beyond except in a couple of comments.

The counts are mine alone. If I was tired or crosseyed at the time I counted – they may be off by a few. I'm easily distracted when I am doing something that could be run on autopilot like counting... Also, some of the subunits in country catalogs are tough to keep straight. South African units, Portugese colonies, and several other units were a challenge simply due to their inherent complexity. The catalogs are great – my counting may not be as good! But here goes.

My plan is to publish 2-4 pages each month until I run out of pages. The listing is 15 pages long using 9 point type (I usually use 11 point). So look for the answer as to how many patterns are cataloged sometime just after next year's dues are due.
