
Perfinned Christmas Seals



Do Denmark and the United States lead in the number of Christmas Seal perfins? Right now – yes.

One might expect owners of personal perforators to perfin other than postal stamps - such as Christmas seals. Ed Haack is one collector who did just that. I have his "Ed" (E 22.5 P) in a 1977 seal and would not be surprised if all of Ed's perfin types appear in Christmas seals several years running. The few other U.S. perfinned seals in my collection are not of the personal variety (see chart on next page). The U.S. and Denmark seals are about equal in number. Even


those Danish seals show evidence of company rather than personal perfinning. The lone French Christmas seal perfin was reported over ten years ago by Jim Estes. I am not aware of any further reports. No doubt many more Christmas seal perfins from countries other than those listed are residing in collections here and abroad. Whether they prove to be personal or business perfins is yet to be seen. And perhaps Denmark and the United States will lose their numero uno position when more reports are forthcoming.
