Anyone who has sorted through a mixture of U. S. perfins has probably found numerous copies of Scott #1029 with the [CU] monogram perfin. I finally looked up the pattern user and the vignette of the stamp. I found that the user was the 'who' commemorated in the vignette of the stamp – Columbia University in New York City. The stamp was issued to commemorate the 200th anniversary of the University.



On checking I found that other combinations exist which range from direct to less obvious; but the relationship is there. Due to the relationship most of the users used an abundance of the perfinned stamps. I am sure I have seen a hundred of the Columbia University one. One could readily put together a nice little collection of these stamps.

P188 (PPI/Eco) – Panama Pacific International Exposition Co. in Sc #398 – Pan Pacific Exposition



W111 – (WIS) – State of Wisconsin in Sc# 957 – Wisconsin State Centennial

S216 (SP) – Southern Pacific Lines in Sc #922 – Completion of the Transcontinental Railway



U56 (U.OF/M) – University of Minnesota in both Sc #1106 – Centenary of Minnesota Statehood Sc# 1026 – Higher Education
