
It's PAGO not PAGADO

Brazil pattern B10 in the *The World Perfins Catalog* is now identified. The single letter P is the first letter of the word PAGO as suggested in The Perfins Bulletin of February 2000 (p. 32) and not PAGADO as suggested in a speculative note in *The World*

Perfins Catalog ("Incomplete – Possible 'Pagado""). This identification is now confirmed by, not only one but, two different perforators! Both are illustrated below. So now we have two PAGOs (=PAID).







This 'P' corresponds to the P of Brazilian pattern B10 (slight discrepancies are a result of your editors poor centering of the cursor in Photoshop).



Distinctly different from pattern B10, this is a newly described PAGO pattern for Brazil.
