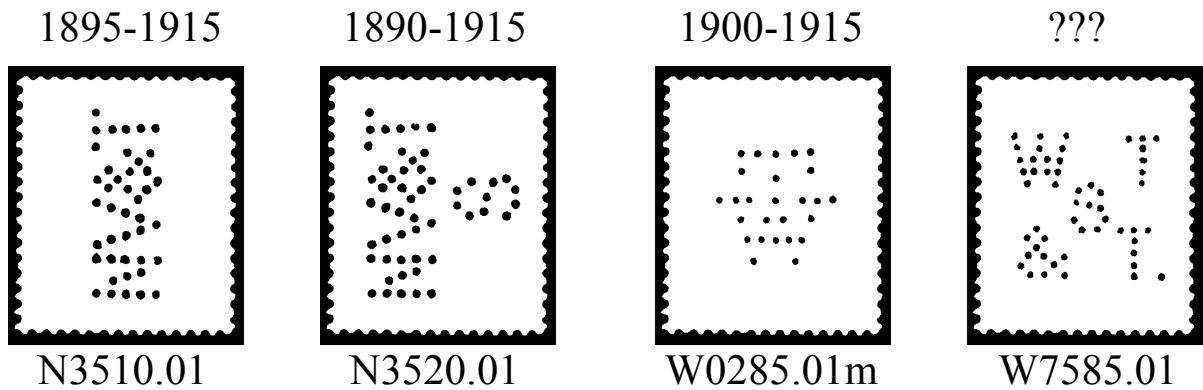


## CAN ANYONE HELP!

**Needham, Veall & Tyzack** (Cutlery Manufacturers) used N3510.01 (suspected) and N3520.01, whereas **W. A. Tyzack & Co**, (Tool Manufacturers) used W0285.01m.
