



Further to the Thomas Cook railway ticket shown in the June Bulletin, **Peter Maybury** has sent in two further Thomas Cook items. The first is a 1d Red, which must have been affixed to a document, which was then perforated with one of the Cook date dies. The second item is a baggage insurance certificate, which was used in Capetown and has a South African stamp on the reverse. The perfin reads COOK/18 CAPT 5/36.
