This illustration showing 'PR/+83', with the '83' presumably for 1883, is also overprinted '*Received for Peter Robinson*'.



However, a similar example showing just "PR/+" (in which a part of the year and month just clip the stamp) was catalogued as P3765.01, and now reinstated - reported on a 16-dot issue 'B', postmarked 'W'.

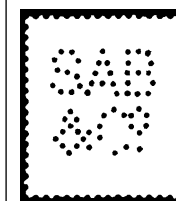


"PR/+84" has also been found on a QV ½d issue 'D' with 'W' pmk.

'Peter Robinson Ltd' were General Drapers, with premises in both Regent St and Oxford St, London W. The Regent St establishment used "P.R/R" (P3960.01) 1878-1897, and the Oxford St branch (probably) used "PR/O" (P3950.01) 1885-1897. Could these "PR/+" patterns have been used in Oxford Street *prior* to receiving their own Perfins in 1885? The company went on to use Perfins up to 1965.



Although not identical, this impression from Sloper m/c N°. 2737, completed 8th July 1871, shows the typical layout.



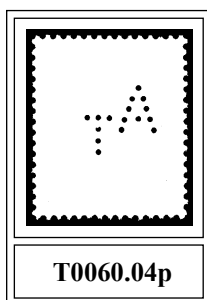
