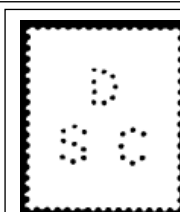

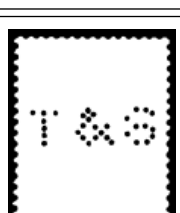

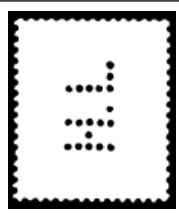

**Re-appraisal note!**

After having inspected over 285 loose examples of H4370.01M, 01a, and 04, it has proved impossible to separate them into the two groups that would have come from the two 'company owned' presses, one used in London WC, and the other in Newcastle-on-Tyne. As a result, H4370.01M has been reconstructed from scratch as shown above to contain the details from all the stamps inspected.



We know that the London Die was multiheaded as this pair shows, sporting a British Industries Fair Slogan postmark which was used nationally between Nov 1926 to Mar 1927.
