



K(1924) 1d, 11/2d - upright Perfin.

L ½d, 1½d, 2½d M ½d-2d, 3d N 1/2d-11/2d O 1/2d-11/2d Q 1/2d-3d, 6d R 1d, 2d, 21/2d

T 1d, 2d, 21/2d (SG480/2/3)

The Perfin is sideways on all definitive sized stamps, 50% reading DOWN the stamp, and 50% UP the stamp. 150 definitive sized examples were inspected.

Pilkington Brothers Ltd, Glass manufacturers, Ident: St Helens, Lancs.

(St) Helens, Lancs. Also Brad(ford).

All of the above stamps were originally catalogued under the 'SPG' (later Type) variable, but have since been determined to be constant (i.e. a 'regular' die).



In use: 1874-1878.

Dates: 8 Mar 1877 - 10 Apr 1878. Issues: QV 1d (SG43) - plates known 134 146 170 171 175 176 188

194 196 197 200 202 QV 2d (SG45) - plates 13, 15 QV 21/2d - plates 8, 9 29 stamps confirmed.

Two pins 'always' missing from Note: the "&" - pointing to a shd.

All examples inspected read down the stamp.



London 'Diamond' (Chief Office), and London EC.

Resulting from a re-appraisal of 'old' S6530.01, the following are unallocated ...

QV 3d - plate 19 - put to press 8th March 1876 (probably S6530.01), and QV 1½d (SG167) - issued 14th Oct 1880 {probably S6530.01a}.



In use: 1880-1885.

23 Apr 1881* - 7 Jan 1884**. Dates: QV ½d (SG48) - plate 12 QV 11/2d (SG51) - plate 3 QV $2\frac{1}{2}d$ - plate 22. QV 3d - plate 20* (wmk n/k)

QV 3d on 3d** - issued 1883. QV 1d, 5d (SG166/9) B 1d (16 dots) 8 stamps confirmed.

Note: All examples inspected read

down the stamp, except the QV 1/2d Bantam which is horizontal.



'Old' S6530.01 has been re-appraised resulting in S6530.01 being re-defined, and a New Die in S6530.01a.



In use: c1930.


Dates: ... Jan 1930. Issues: I(BC) 11/2d

The stamp has been punched from the front of the stamp, making it "TA".



In use: c1912. Dates: 27 July 1912. Issues: F 21/2d

H 1/2d, 1d

Pmks: Liverpool.







The last two plus another 1d 'H' all have the same postmark, and would have been used on the same cover. Note - 21/2d was the base rate for posting 'abroad' at the time - info Andy Donaldson.
