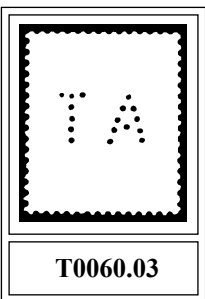
Note: The Perfin is sideways on all definitive sized stamps, 50% reading **DOWN** the stamp, and 50% **UP** the stamp. **150** definitive sized examples were inspected.

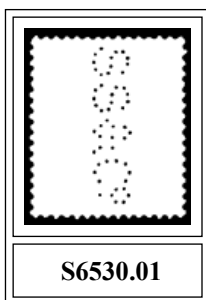

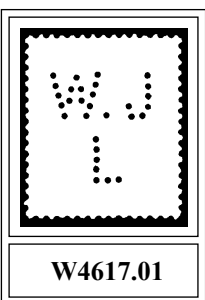

Resulting from a re-appraisal of 'old' S6530.01, the following are unallocated ...

QV 3d - plate 19 - put to press 8th March 1876 {probably S6530.01}, and **QV 1½d (SG167)** - issued 14th Oct 1880 {probably S6530.01a}.
