 inspection of *forty-five* examples, two quite separate dies
 were revealed - D4394.01a, in use 1902-1912, and 4394.01,
 in use 1912-1915. Based on postmarks, both dies would
 have been used by the *same user*, with initialled stamps
 being supplied *to* the user *from* an unknown supplier.

Progressive pin loss on issue I(RC) points to a *single headed die*.
 All pins were still intact 9th August 1913.
