

Note: **Underlined** Catalogue Numbers are **unpublished New Dies with an identity**, and have been illustrated separately, along with other New Dies which lack an identity.

We start with 24,983 DD as at 25th October 2021, increasing to 24,984 after spotting that "B.C." (B1150.07) was in 'Gault' but not 'All Dies'!

Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp (reported by **Jack Brandt**) pmk London W. Die in use 1915-1920.

E2610.02 E&L/C/GC 10,14,7/9/10,9 4½ I Ø Edinburgh & Leith Corporation Gas Commissioners,
25 Waterloo Place, Edinburgh. Also elsewhere
including Portobello, and Granton.

Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp (reported by **Finn Binderkrantz**), but without postmark evidence, purely on the unusual set of letters. Die in use c1905.

F0430.01 FB/L^d 8,14/7,7 5 **Delete Fuerst Brothers ... in 'Tomkins' and 'Gault'!**

Note: The identity appeared *without confirmation* sometime between 1973 and the mid 1980's. We can safely delete the identity as the company did not take on 'Limited' liability until sometime between 1915 and 1918, yet the die is known used from c1905.

{Est 1919}. [POKO's - Mail Room customer List].

Note: Identity *suspected* from a list of Mail Room's POKO customers, and stamps postmarked '475' in Triangle (Loughborough). Die in use 1928-1935. This suspected identity *replaces* the General Life Assurance Co Ltd currently in 'Gault' (1st Edn) and 'Tomkins' (11th Edn).

G3060.03 GL 11,8 5½ Genatosan Ltd,
Pharmaceutical & Chemical Mfrs, Loughborough.
{Est 1919}. [POKO's - Mail Room customer List].

Note: Identity *suspected* from a list of Mail Room's POKO customers, and stamps postmarked '475' in Triangle (Loughborough). Die in use 1923-1933. On re-evaluation of the original cover and contents, the Perfin is G3060.**03**, and there is sufficient evidence in the pamphlet for a *positive identity*. This *replaces* the General Life Assurance Co Ltd suspected identity currently in 'Gault' (1st Edition) and 'Tomkins' (11th Edition).

H0530.02d HB/&C^o 10,11/12,7,4 4½ Ia Ø Houlder Bros & Co Ltd, Glasgow.

Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp (reported by **Jack Brandt**) postmarked Glasgow. Die in use c1945.

I0080.03 IBC 5,13,8 5 Ø Ilkeston BC, Ilkeston, Derbyshire.

Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp (reported by **Bart Berends**) postmarked Ilkest(on). Die in use c1935.

J0470.04 J.B 7,13 4½ Ø Jaffe Bros & Co Ltd, Linen & Jute Merchants and
Manufacturers, 5 Donegal Sq South, Belfast.

Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp (reported by **Bart Berends**) pmk 'Donegal Sq., Belfast' Die in use 1885-1920. Prior to this the Belfast office used stamps Perfined "JAFFE" (J0170.01M) supplied by the H/O in Dundee.

J2600.01 J/EX 8/10,9 5 Ø Jersey Express (& Channel Islands Advertiser),
13 Broad St, St Helier, Jersey.

Note: Identity *suspected* from loose stamps postmarked '409' Jersey. Die in use 1882-1900. The company took on 'Limited' liability in 1900, but went out of business in October 1901.

L1965.01 LEVER/B 7,10,9,10,11/145 The Lever Wholesale Grocery Co Ltd, Bolton.

Note: Identity *completed* from a loose stamp with a partial identity ...*sale Grocery Co (Limited)*. Die in use c1890. Established 22nd May 1887, re-named W H S Taylor & Co Ltd in Feb 1898.

Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp (reported by **Jack Brandt**) pmk '878' (Wigan). Die in use c1890. Established 22nd May 1887, re-named W H S Taylor & Co Ltd in Feb 1898.

L3530.02b L&L/FO 7,14,7/8,10 5 III Ø London & Lancashire Fire Insurance Co Ltd,
155 Leadenhall St, London EC. Die in use c1912.

Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp (reported by **Finn Binderkrantz**) without pmk evidence, just lettering.

Q0010.01 Q 10 4½ Ø Quick, Reek & Smith Ltd,
Coffee Importers, 24/25 Great Tower St,
London EC3. Die in use 1941-1945.

Note: Identity *suspected* without postmark confirmation. A single headed "Q" die is in the Sloper m/s ledger as a replacement for another single headed "Q" die, believed destroyed in the "Blitz" on Sloper's premises in May 1941. The die destroyed was probably Q0015.01, in use by the company 1890-1941.

Q0230.01p QH 10,10 4½ Ø The Queen's Hospital for Children,
Hackney Rd, London E2.

Note: Identity *suspected* without postmark evidence. This is old Q0230.01, die in use c1941.

Q0230.02 QH 10,9 4½ Ø The Queen's Hospital for Children,
Hackney Rd, London E.

Note: Identity *suspected* without postmark evidence. Die in use 1907-1908. This is likely to be a 2-letter 'SPG' (later) type, probably followed by "QHC" (Q0260.04), in use 1908-1930. Q0230.02 is known from only one stamp, a 1d 'F', so if another is found it may well show typical 'SPG' variations, in which case the catalogue number will be allocated the suffix 'v'.

Originally established in 1867 in Bethnal Green as the Dispensary for Women and Children, it moved in 1868 to premises in Hackney, and was later renamed North Eastern Hospital for Children. New buildings were added in 1902, and in **1907** it was renamed again to the **Queen's Hospital for Children**.

{Mill closed in 1890}.

Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp (reported by **Finn Binderkrantz**) pmk '98' Da(lkei)th, AU 19/87. Die in use 1885-1890.

T4940.03 TWA 7,13,10 5 Ø T W Allen & Sons Ltd, Timber Merchants, Hull.

Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp (reported by **Alastair Walter**) postmarked ... Yorkshire. Die in use 1939-1945. See also "TWA" (T4940.02) in use 1890-1915, and "TWA" (T4940.01M) in use from 1973.

W2760.01ap WF/&S 12,7/12,9 4½ Ia Ø W Forster & Son, Tea, Coffee & Provision
Merchants, 9 Philpot Lane, London EC3.

Note: Identity *suspected* without postmark confirmation from a loose stamp (reported by **Steve Netten**). This 'SWP' would have been used for a relatively short time, say 1941-1945, after "WF/&S" (W2760.02) had been destroyed in the "Blitz" on Sloper's premises in May 1941, and before a new "WF/&S" single headed die (W2760.01) had been made by J Sloper & Co.

Z0009.01 Z 9 8½ Ø Church of England Zenana Missionary Society,
19 & 21 Conway St, London W1.

Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp (reported by **Philippe Antheaume**) without postmark confirmation. This looks to be similar to a number of 'attempts' at a crude "Z" during WWII. Die in use c1945.

Note: Identity *suspected* from a group of KGVI & EII Foreign Bills, some non-Perfin examples showing 'The National Bank of Australia' cachet. Dated Perfin examples range between 1 JUL 1956 and ... 1960.

U0215.01 UBA 8,11,8 4½

The Union Bank of Australia Ltd,
1 Bank Buildings, London EC.
{'Union Ban...' on a Foreign Bill on piece}.

Note: Known on QV Foreign Bills dated between 6 June 1890 and 15 July 1892. Die in use 1890-1895.

U0220.01 UBA in Diamond 9,9,8 (in 36) 3½ Ø

The Union Bank of Australia Ltd,
London.

Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp postmarked London 'Diamond' (Chief Office). Also known on QV Foreign Bills dated between 5 June 1875 and 1 Sep 1881. Die in use 1875-1885. Formed in 1837, it took on 'Limited' liability in 1870}.

Note: This positive identity comes from a cachet on a B16 used as a receipt. This *replaces* the suspected identity in G.B. 'Gault' (1st Edn), Tomkins (11th Edn), and Irish 'Gault' (1st Edn- D160.01M). Die in use 1895-1900.

Note: This cover *may* represent some sort of 'Emergency' use of "G" being dated so close to when Sloper's in-house dies are believed to have been destroyed in the "Blitz" - the night of 10th May 1941.

London and elsewhere. Single headed die in use c1886.

Note: The item is a QV ½d (br) Type 2a, postmarked MR 2/86, Gate(shead) '(30)9', addressed to The Editor, *Financier*, Royal Exchange Buildings, London. Reports Traffic returns W/E 27th Feb 1886. Interestingly, passenger receipts only account for 25% of the £103,400 revenue that week. The *Financier* publication was still being printed in 1899.

Note: Identity comes from a combination cover with the address typed on the envelope flap, postmarked London 'F.S', 17 OCT/1941. 6d 'Q' with "H/B" (H0420.07p) and a 9d 'Q' with "HB/&C^o" (H0530.02bM) already known used by Houlder Brothers & Co Ltd. The 9d stamp would represent 'old stock' as the die would have been destroyed 5 months earlier in the "Blitz" on Sloper's premises in May 1941.
