Mr Young has the die on the followin stamps K.E.V11 ½d pale green, K.G.V. ½d (1911-12), K.G.V, 1d (S.G.358), all of which would fit the dates that the Company operated, but none of which have a legible postmark.

Can anyone else shed further light on this one, either with further examples or postmarks?

BRITISH SOUTH AFRICAN REVENUE CANCELS

By Mike J. Burrows

In the U.S.A. two items have been published in the Perfins Bulletin during 1976*. This has prompted me to check my files and attempt to gather together the several bits and pieces of information that lie scattered about in the pages of the philatelic press.

At least four different types of perfin cancellation are known. Three of which are recorded doing revenue duty:

1. Single hole measuring 2.5 to 3mm in diameter.
2. USED 12,11,14,13 7mm
3. Date in three lines - various spacings.
4. BSA/C 13,12,10,9 5mm Two different dies.

An article by Robson Lowe in the Philatelist for October 1975, gives details of a recent discovery of printers records and file copies. From this excellent treatise the following data has been extracted, with the addition of Forbin** numbers.

This first printing was ordered on 24th September 1896. Produced in sheets of 20, perforated 15. Another value was ordered on 16th January 1903, perforated 14.5.

The £50, £100 and £200 perfinned single hole (file copies) are illustrated in colour on the back page of the Philatelist for November 1975. In the Robson Lowe Revenue Sale for the 10th September 1976, these lots were on offer:

- Lot 2183 £50, two copies, one cancelled "MINES OFFICE/BULAWAYO" and the other "MINING COMMISSIONER'S OFFICE", both pin-perforated "USED" Valuation £25 (£16 was realised).
- Lot 2184 £30 and £50 both cancelled by perforating. Valuation £20 (no bid recorded)
- Lot 2185 £50 and £100, both with purple cancellation and pin-perforated "USED". Valuation £20 (£34 was realised).

The £50 is illustrated in the catalogue.

The author questions whether it is perfins or perfinned stamps that are collected. Displays which show only the backs of stamps with perfins in them, open such collectors to ridicule. Collections and displays using perfinned stamps mounted face upwards provide more interest for both perfin and non-perfin collectors. As an example, Czechoslovakian perfins can be found on the stamps of up to six different postal administrations - a point which would be lost if only the backs of stamps were shown.

The postage stamps of the Anglo-Egyptian Sudan, Bright & Son, London, 1912, pp. 41-48.

On Feb. 8th., 1900, a supply of 5 mills stamps of Egypt overprinted "Soudan" were issued perforated S.G. (Service Gouvernemental) in an attempt to mitigate abuses of the free postage system. Two values of the 1898 definitive set were issued, similarly perforated, the following year - 1 mil. (1000 issued) and 5 mills (500 issued). The perforated series was replaced by overprints - O.S.G.S. - in 1903.

Perfins on U.S. Revenue stamps are a large, generally disregarded, field. They have an added complication compared with postal perfins in that perforating was a widely used method of cancelling the stamps once they were affixed to the tax form so that stamps can be found with a true perfin to prevent pilfering, plus a perforated cancellation.

A brief priced list of the O.U.S. overprints and underprints including varieties. A list of ld red plate numbers known with this overprint is also included.

AUTHOR INDEX

This author, index covers Perfins Abstracts number 0001 to 0150, from March 1975 to March 1977.

Titles given after each author, are often shortened or amended from the original to make the subject more obvious. Reference is always to Abstract number.

Catalogues are indexed under the name by which they are best known - usually the second name of the publisher, e.g. Gibbons S., etc. Anonymous articles are indexed under the title of the periodical in which they appeared for completeness.

PERFINS ABSTRACTS
ABBREVIATIONS OF PERIODICAL TITLES

March, 1977

Prior to abstract number 0110, periodical titles were given in full. Subsequently, they have been abbreviated in accordance with British Standard, BS 4148 part 2, 1975. This is a joint venture based on International co-operation and I believe that this standard has also been adopted by the American National Standards Institution.

The standard itself consists of a list of some 7000 words which are commonly used in the titles of periodicals (not only in English). Since no philatelic periodicals are included, I have found it necessary to abbreviate some words myself (based on the recommendations in BS 4148 part 1.) Such words are also included in the following list in their own right.

SUBJECT INDEX

In an attempt to make PERFINS ABSTRACTS as useful as possible, this index has been constructed from a large number of keywords and, wherever possible, actual perfins derived from the text of the articles themselves, are included.

All entries in the index refer to perfins unless otherwise indicated.

Arrangement is primarily by countries. For each country there will be two alphabetical sections, the first is a list of perfins and the second a list of subjects. (It should be noted that in the perfin list the ampersand has been counted as the twenty seventh letter such that A & A comes after AZ.) Those items in the subject list which could be sought irrespective of country e.g. Railways, forgeries, etc., are cross-referenced as major terms followed by the respective country e.g. "Great Britain - Forgeries" would also be found under "Forgeries - Great Britain". However, items have only been indexed under particular subjects where that subject was mentioned in the text e.g. "Great Britain - GWR" would not appear under "Great Britain - Railways" if it was not pointed out in the text that GWR stood for Great Western Railway:- An identity of a perf in user has never been assumed for the purpose of this index, even where it appeared obvious. The subject index is by no means complete with respect to collecting topics since it was difficult to determine what would be of interest. Generally, only topics which had an article written about them have been included. Suggestions of topics which could be included in future index will be appreciated by the author.

Each country or subject is usually followed by a further term (or terms) in order to make the index as specific as possible. Cross-references take the following form: for the basic term "FRANCE - XYZ";

Cross-reference (1) "See - ZYX" means see "FRANCE - ZYX"

(2) "see GERMANY - " means see "GERMANY - XYZ".

Where an article attempts to include all of a certain countries perfins or is in fact a catalogue, it will be found under "COUNTRY - Catalogue".

The various types of security endorsement, except perfins, are listed both by country and also under their own titles e.g. Overprints, Manuscript, Underprints, Embossing, Advertising Rings. Only items about perfins in general or where the country involved would be irrelevant e.g. collecting, exhibiting, etc., are included under Perfins.
