The Library It is now two years since I began to publish Perfins Abstracts and the latest batch brings the total issued up to 150. Although this is no great number, I feel that it is about time to publish some indexes - firstly an author index, then a detailed subject index. The appearance of the indexes will, I hope, stimulate researchers to dig deeper into the literature whilst allowing less advanced collectors to locate general works on any topic - mounting, collecting, sorting, displaying etc.

From time to time the Library obtains items written in various foreign languages. Since most of our members are English speaking, it is my policy to have these translated whenever possible. At the moment I have the facility for translations from French, German, Spanish, Italian and Russian. I need translators for Dutch, the Scandinavian Languages and East European Languages at the moment - any offers.

NIPPON YUSEN KAISHA

This enterprise has its beginnings in the first Japanese steamship venture, the Kaiso Kaish (Steam Transport Company).

Financed by the Government at an early stage they were able to buy up the Yokohama - Shanghai service of the Pacific Mail steam Ship Company.

In 1882 the Japanese Government gave its support to a faster shipping project. This resulted in the creation of the Kydo Unya Kaisha (Union Transport Company).

Intense rivalry between the two companies came to a climax when they were amalgamated as the Nippon Yusen Kaisha (Japan Mail Steamship Company) in 1885.

A passenger service between Japan and Seattle is believed to have commenced in 1896, when an arrangement with Hill's Great Northern Railway was made. The Miike Maru arriving in America on August 21st.

From early days financial and other support was forthcoming from the Mitsu Bishi Kaisa (Three Diamonds Company).

A London Office for the Nippon Yusen Kaisha was to be found at Lloyds Avenue, E.C.3., in the 1920's. At this time the Company had over one hundred vessels on its books.

Prior to the 1941 hostilities the Office was lodged at Cunard House, Leadenhall Street, E.C.3.
