ELUSIVE EVERETTS

By Mike J. Burrows.

At the 12th Philatelic Congress of Great Britain held at Cambridge in 1926, Dr. Grodon Ward presented his paper 'Thief - Proof Stamps & Legitimate Philately'. Part of this discourse concerned the Everett stamp thief detector. Later this information was incorporated in the series by Bertram McGowan that appeared in the British Philatelist during 1926-27.

Charles Jennings gave a very full description of the device in his article 'Security Endorsement Machines & Processes' published by the Society in News-Sheet No.6, May-June 1958 (out of print). Further facts, amendments and amplification can be found on pages 29 and 30 of his magnum opus published in parts beginning in 1968.

Mention of the underprint was made by member Dr. Reg. W. Powell in 'A K.E.VII. Miscellany' which can be found in the G.B. Journal, Volume 13, page 14.

For members who do not have access to the above references, here is a brief description of the apparatus patented by Arthur Everett of William Henry Everett & Son Limited, wholesale news-vendors of 11, St. Bride Street, London, E.C.

An ink roller-pad was kept in contact with a rubber roller containing-rows of the required insignia. Each row had six of these dies. In this case the initials WH/E&S/Ltd. By using the hand-machine in a similar manner to the rubber roller multi-colour stampers of today, it was possible to overprint, on top of the gum, several postage stamps in a single operation.

It had taken many years before Everetts persuaded the Post Office to accept this form of private protection. Permission being finally granted in 1903. In an attempt to publicize the invention it was offered for sale in the contemporary press at £1 each, but it is doubtful if any were ever sold.

Bearing in mind that the ink used was probably that normally associated with the conventional rubber stamps then in use, and that the impressions were made over the gum, it is doubtful if any legitimately used examples could still exist, considering that they would have to be removed from the original material to which they had been affixed. Furthermore, any mint examples might still be considered the property of the security conscious originators.

Nevertheless, the following are recorded as having been seen, over the years, with this security device, overprinted either in purple or violet. Whether mint or used was not stated.

K.E.VII. ½d dark green, 1d, 1½d, 2d ordinary paper, 2½d, 6d
K.G.V. 1d die III.

By 1915 the war had made such inroads into the staff that most had been replaced by less reliable casuals, resulting in the management deciding to conform to the more normal method of security by having its stocks of stamps perfined with a large single E.

Although Dr. Gordon Ward gave this information in 1926, the new illustrated catalogue does not carry this identification. For a company that has attracted the attention of several philatelic writers, it does seem that the products of W.H. Everett & Son Limited security methods are destined for oblivion.

GOOLE STEAM SHIPPING COMPANY LIMITED

G.S.S. 10,10,10

When the regular service from Goole to the Continent ceased with the bankruptcy of Messrs Watson, Cuneliffe & Company in 1864, it left a large void in the trading prosperity of the area. To overcome this, several local land owners formed the Goole Steam Shipping Company Limited.

This company maintained steady progress taking over, in 1895, the Humber Steam Shipping Company Limited and the Yorkshire Coal & Steamship Company Limited.

As Sir George Armytage, the Chairman of the Lancashire & Yorkshire Railway, was also a director of the Goole Steam Shipping Company Limited, it was inevitable that the 'Lanky' obtained government sanction to take over the G.S.S., in 1904. This was achieved by the purchase of the entire fleet on 2nd January 1905.

Following the practise that seems normal for the time the G.S.S, name continued to be used for publicity purposes.

The black days of the depression saw most of the fleet still in existence taken over by a four company consortium in May 1935. Owing between them twenty five cross-channel steamers the Consortium, which included the Hull & Netherlands Steamship Company Limited and Wilson's & North Eastern Railway Shipping Company Limited, decided upon a single management, 'Associated Humber Steamship Lines Control Committee', to run Associated Humber Lines.

Registered in 1957 as a limited liability company, the Associated Humber Lines came under the control of the British Transport Commission who had 91% of the shares. The rest being lodged with Ellerman's Wilson Line. In 1963 the Transport Holding Company took over. The next change was in 1969 to the National Freight Corporation.

Only a few members reported holding examples of this die.

Miss Wright tells me that she has the perfin on,
1923 Pasteur 1f50 blue.
Merson Type 60c
1f dated 1922.

Mr Brandt says that he has the perfin on both postal and revenue issue. "The revenue one is on a 'Wagons-Lits' ticket which shows the Cook name, and also the cancel of the reverse shows THOS. COOK & SONS. S.A., with a Paris address.

PUBLIC TRUSTEE OFFICE

This perfin was reported by ex member Mr W. Pieterse who had a cover used by the Public Trustee, London and franked with four 1d K.G.V. stamps. The cover was postmarked 14th April 1914 and had the inscription "ON HIS MAJESTY'S SERVICE" printed on it.

The Public Trustee Office was opened in 1908 so it is possible that perfins exist from that date.

SUBJECT INDEX

In an attempt to make PERFINS ABSTRACTS as useful as possible, this index has been constructed from a large number of keywords and, wherever possible, actual perfins derived from the text of the articles themselves, are included.

All entries in the index refer to perfins unless otherwise indicated.

Arrangement is primarily by countries. For each country there will be two alphabetical sections, the first is a list of perfins and the second a list of subjects. (It should be noted that in the perfin list the ampersand has been counted as the twenty seventh letter such that A & A comes after AZ.) Those items in the subject list which could be sought irrespective of country e.g. Railways, forgeries, etc., are cross-referenced as major terms followed by the respective country e.g. "Great Britain - Forgeries" would also be found under "Forgeries - Great Britain". However, items have only been indexed under particular subjects where that subject was mentioned in the text e.g. "Great Britain - GWR" would not appear under "Great Britain - Railways" if it was not pointed out in the text that GWR stood for Great Western Railway:- An identity of a perf in user has never been assumed for the purpose of this index, even where it appeared obvious. The subject index is by no means complete with respect to collecting topics since it was difficult to determine what would be of interest. Generally, only topics which had an article written about them have been included. Suggestions of topics which could be included in future index will be appreciated by the author.

Each country or subject is usually followed by a further term (or terms) in order to make the index as specific as possible. Cross-references take the following form:
for the basic term "FRANCE - XYZ";

Cross-reference (1) "See - ZYX" means see "FRANCE - ZYX"
(2) "see GERMANY - " means see "GERMANY - XYZ".

Where an article attempts to include all of a certain countries perfins or is in fact a catalogue, it will be found under "COUNTRY - Catalogue".

The various types of security endorsement, except perfins, are listed both by country and also under their own titles e.g. Overprints, Manuscript, Underprints, Embossing, Advertising Rings. Only items about perfins in general or where the country involved would be irrelevant e.g. collecting, exhibiting, etc., are included under Perfins.
