This 13-pin perforated initial "K" is not known on GB postage stamps.


## **Production Trial Labels.**

Many different testing, demonstration, and advertising labels were produced by various stamp production related companies, including 'Harrison & Sons'. Here we see Britannia seated, facing right, with

## HARRISON & SONS STAMP ENGRAVERS & PRINTERS LONDON

printed in purple-brown (also known in light brown) on gummed perforated paper with Harrison's house watermark. These particular testing labels date to production trials held c1911.


