This is likely to be the *single headed* "OL" die listed in the m/s ledger, which was destroyed in the "Blitz" on Sloper's Budge Row premises in May 1941. The initials "OL" are thought to signify the Society of **O**ur **L**ady at Lourdes., formed in 1912 by the Catholic Association to care for the sick on the English National Pilgrimage to Lourdes.

And also trading at 32 Cannon St, London EC, and at Bow Common under the style of '**Britannia Rubber & Kamptulicon Co**', has been dissolved from 1<sup>st</sup> April 1878. *London Gazette*.

'Flexible & Thick' Kamptulicon, was a floor covering made from powdered cork and natural rubber, patented by Elijah Galloway in 1843. 'Kamptulicon' was first launched in public at the 1862 International Exhibition in London, where it caused a sensation. Its promoters compared it to thick, soft leather, and lauded its ease of cleaning, water resistance, warmth, and sound-deadening qualities. *Wikipedia*.

Note: This die, originally reported by *Stephen Steere* on 16-dot 1d Lilacs, has been reinstated due to a new find by *Richard Parsons*. Steve has two stamps, one overprinted '*Received for Peter Robinson*' and perforated "PR/+", and the other postally used with "PR/+83". Richard's stamp, also postally used, is Perfinned "PR/+84". The two dates suggest the practice of using a Receipt die to initial stamps intended for postage was in use for some time, hence the reinstatement.
