Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp postmarked '4(05)' (Ips)wich. Die in use c1870.

Henry John Broad (1822-1882) during the period 1861-1882 was a Photographer & Haberdasher (1861), and a Drysalter (1865 & 1869) at Diss (Norfolk), followed by a Baking Powder Manufacturer (1871), and Baking, Egg, Soap, and washing Powder Manufacturer (1875) at Ipswich (Suffolk).

B0025.03 B (Double-lined) 58 12 Ø Westinghouse Brake Co Ltd,
Canal Rd, and Northern Wharf, York Rd, London N.

Note: The Identity comes from an envelope front with the addressee pre-printed in a fancy script - 'Westinghouse Eisenbahn Bremsen Gesellschaft, (Westinghouse Brake Co Ltd), Hamburg, Germany. The postmark was London N, JU 2/86. Die in use 1882-1886.

Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp postmarked '405' (Ipswich). Die in use 1877-1880.

and London House Yard, London EC.

Note: Identity *suspected* from loose stamps postmarked London 'Diamond' (Chief Office). Die in use 1875-1890.

Warehousemen, 8-14 St Paul's Churchyard, London EC.
{Became 'Pawsons & Leafs Ltd' in 1892}.
Sporadic use after 1892.

Note: Identity *suspected* from loose stamps pmk London EC, and 'national' postmarks. Die in use 1871-1892, and c1925.
This *suspected* identity replaces the *suspected* identity of 'Price's Patent Candle Co', both 'G3', and 'Tomkins'.

P1060.01 PCL^d 13,11,7,7 5½ Pawson & Co Ltd, Warehousemen,
8-14 St Paul's Churchyard, and 14-24 & 47 Carter Lane,
London EC. Later used (briefly) by Pawsons & Leafs Ltd,
Warehouseman, 14-22 (later 14-26) Carter Lane,
and 8-14 (later 5-14) St Paul's Churchyard, London EC.
{Cover pmk London, NO 18/92}. Die in use 1882-1893.
[London Trade directories for ... 1884, 1899, 1902, 1910,
1914, 1920, 1928, 1933, 1948].

Note: The user's name was hand-stamped on the envelope flap. Prior to 1892, when 'Pawsons & Leafs Ltd' was established by amalgamation, the user would have been '**Pawson & Co Ltd**'. Firm still in business in both Carter Lane and St Paul's Churchyard in 1949, but taken over in 1967.

Courtesy of the COGBS website (Mike Behm & Mark Matlach) ... In 1780 William Leaf established a Wholesale Silk Warehouse in London EC, becoming 'Leaf & Co Ltd' in 1877. In 1832 John F Pawson set up 'I F Pawson & Co', Textile & Clothing wholesale company at 5-9 St Paul's Churchyard, becoming 'Pawson & Co', then 'Pawson & Co Ltd' in 1873. Finally, in 1892 the two companies merged to form '**Pawsons & Leafs Ltd**'. The various companies were prolific users of *Commercial Overprints*!

Gateshead. [1898 Newcastle Trade directory, but no
mention in the 1894 and 1910 editions].

Note: Identity *suspected* from loose stamps postmarked Newcastle-on-Tyne. Die in use 1895-1900.

Note: Identity *suspected* from loose stamps postmarked '466' and (London) SW. Die in use 1875-1884.

Y0008.02 Y (Narrow) 8 7½ Ø E W Yates & Co,
Bankers, 45 Castle St, Liverpool. {In July 1904, they
were taken over by the 'Union Bank of Manchester'}.

Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp postmarked '466' Liverpool. Die in use 1880-1904.

In 1898 the 'United Turkey Red Co' was incorporated through the amalgamation of the Dunbartonshire Turkey-red dyeing firms of '*John Orr Ewing & Co*' at Alexandria, '*Archibald Orr Ewing & Co*' at Levenfield, and '*William Stirling & Sons*' at Dalquhurn and Cordale. See also "UTR/C°L" (U1930.01), in use 1908-1915.

J6447.01 J.R/B 7,12/13 5½ Ø James Rudman,
Colour & Varnish Works, River St, Frome Bridge, Bristol.

Note: Identity *suspected* from loose stamps postmarked Bristol. Die in use 1905-1915. This suspected identity **replaces** the suspected identity already in 'G3' and 'Tomkins'. "J.R./.. ." (J6425.01) has a positive identity - see under Nick Bridgwater - but James Rudman (1850-1898) died leaving his business to his 14 year old son, Henry James Gilbert Rudman (1884-1956). Henry would have been able to assume control when he was 21 years old, in 1905.

O0525.01 O&C°./L^d. 10,13,8,6/7,6 5 III Ø Owen & Co Ltd, 'Ely Paper Works', Cardiff.

Note: There were two possible users suggested in the Bulletin article 'Daniel Owen - Squire of Ystradowen' which appeared in B443 (February 2021), and this is the better fit as it plugs the gap between the monogram T5400.01m, in use 1892-1895, and "O" (O0012.01) known to have been used by the company 1905-1941.

Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp (reported by Philippe Antheaume) pmk Bradford. Die in use 1905-1910.

Paper Makers, Hele Paper Mill, Hele, Devon.

Note: Identity *suspected* from loose stamps (reported by *Mike Behm*) postmarked Hele, (Exe)ter, Devon. Die in use 1950-1954. The paper mill is still in operation today.
