Variations in the pin spacing when comparing letters, and that all three strikes are in horizontal alignment, the die was *multithesded*.

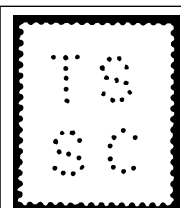
