U0910.02, U0910.04, U0910.01p, U0910.03, U0910.01b, U0910.01c, and U0910.01M, as well as U0060.01M, U0060.01av, U0060.04a, U0060.04p, U0040.05, U0060.06, U0060.06a, U0090.01M, U0090.02, U0095.01, and U0100.01, covering the period 1929-1995.

2. "F.H" (F1770.03) - this is "F.H/&Co" (F1810.01) with blind pins below. Ron Mills
