Note: Probably *two multiheaded* dies (in the horizontal) were involved fitted to company owned presses. However, due to the generally poor nature of the strikes - upright, sideways, partials, and a great many with missing pins - it's not realistically possible to allocate with any certainty any particular example to a specific die. Consequently, the details for old P1040.01aM have been combined with P1040.01M, and old P1040.01aM left as a Beware!. As a result, the following stamps have not been confirmed.

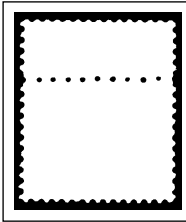

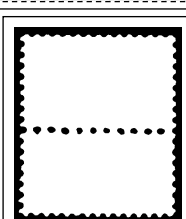

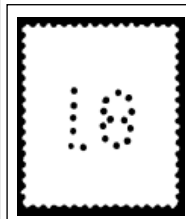
