

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PERFORATED POSTAL STATIONERY

INTRODUCTION

The use of perforation for security on stamps was introduced by Joseph Sloper in 1868 but it would be several years before it was applied to postal stationery. Post cards were introduced in 1870 and the earliest recorded perforated card is March 1872.

No real attempt has been made previously to compile a comprehensive listing of perforated postal stationery. This has probably been because the material presented in this catalogue is, in general, very scarce. A short listing was made in the Cinderella Philatelist in 1965/66 but the listing does not use Perfin Society catalogue numbers and so some of the items listed are hard to identify. In 1983 Rosemary Smith put out an appeal in the Perfin Society Bulletin for information on perfinned postal stationery. A worksheet was prepared and sent to members that expressed interest and some useful information was received. Due to personal circumstance the project had to be put on hold and was not resumed until 1996.

By Perforated Postal Stationery we are talking about all pre stamped items with a perfin die perforated through the stamp printed on the cover. Perforated Postal Stationery falls into five (and a bit!) sections: Post Cards; Newspaper Wrappers; Air Letters; Registered Envelopes; Envelopes; (and Telegraph Forms). To date no perfin dies have been found on letter cards although a couple of dies have been found on reply paid postcards.

The first chapter of this catalogue attempts to understand how the perforation of stationery was carried out. This is an area of the study that needs much more research. The second chapter concentrates on Postal Stationery Postcards and Reply Paid Postcards but exclude the cards with Sloper Experimental Cancels as these are covered in Chapter 8. Further chapters tackle each of the stationery types.

Because of the scarcity of the material this catalogue has relied in information from members of the Perfin Society and the Postal Stationery Society. Information has been gleaned from literature and from local societies. Many of the items are only known from a single copy or even only a single cut-out. Much information is still to be found so if anyone reading this catalogue finds that they have a new item please do not hesitate to get in touch with the authors.

CHAPTER 1**PERFORATED STATIONERY PRODUCTION**

At the start of this project it was widely assumed that companies would buy a perforating machine for their stamps and would use it for any odd item of postal stationery that might go through the post room. However it was soon realised that this might be over simplistic. For example a Queen Victoria wrapper is shown below with a ½d Green Type 2 and with two additional ½d bantams - all three perfinned. At first glance it seemed that all three stamps are struck with R/F&Co – R1810.02M – used by Robinson Fleming & Co, merchants, London. This die is one of a few where the die configuration has been determined from misplaced and broken pins and is known to have been a multi-headed die - 6 x 1. So that raised the question as to how a 6 x 1 die could be used to perforate the wrapper itself. Closer examination of the wrapper perfin showed that the die in fact was not R1801.02M but a similar die – almost certainly single headed. This die is now designated it as R1810.02a.



This observation raised the whole question of how stationery was perforated by companies or by the perforators such as Joseph Sloper. The stamp impression on all wrappers is set approximately three inches from the top of the sheet and well away from the edge of the wrapper. So a conventional single die machine would not be able to reach the stamp impression from the top but would probably have to reach in from the side. Looking again at the wrapper it was noted that the strike of the perfin is at an angle and it is assumed that the machine used had the perfin die set at 90 degrees to normal and that the strike was made from the side of the wrapper.

It is somewhat surprising that companies would have gone to the additional expense of purchasing another perfin machine simply to handle postal stationery, which would have been of much smaller use. However it is clear that in most cases the machine that they had purchased for their stamps would simply not work for stationery. Postcards and wrappers could be perfinned from the side. Registered envelopes could be perfinned on their flaps but

envelopes would present an even greater challenge. Colin Baker, Secretary of the Postal Stationery Society who is currently working on an update of the Huggins catalogue writes:-

“Paper for STO envelopes had to be submitted to the stamping office in flat sheets, with an indication of where the stamps were to be impressed. Companies would either have the sheets pre-printed before stamping, or would do so afterwards. In either case they had to tell the stamping office where to strike the stamps. Once the paper was stamped it would then be made up into envelopes, probably by the same firm that did the initial printing. Similarly I believe that Post Office issue envelopes could be bought in flat sheets so that firms could print their own details on them more easily. I believe the perforating machines used to stamp firms initials through stationery were generally quite small, probably capable of punching only one item at a time, especially if the company only used a relatively small number of stationery items. This would have been made it more difficult to perforate whole sheets before envelopes were folded and glued. However a firm like the Army and Navy stores, using a large number of envelopes could have had a perforating plate which would have stamped the whole sheet at once i.e. before the envelopes were completed. Alternatively they could have had a machine with a long reach but I think this is unlikely.”

The vast majority of perfins found on postal stationery envelopes are made through the whole envelope. However envelopes used by the Army & Navy Co-operative Society are found perforated only through the stamp. There have also been a report of a Furness Railway envelope similarly perforated but this particular item has not been seen by the authors. It seems that the Army and Navy had their envelopes perforated during production of the envelope but direct evidence of this still needs to be found.

The letter illustrated below is taken from the Joseph Sloper, Order and Impressions ledger and is dated April 5th 1869.

"Dear Horace,

Please put in hand a Die like "CORY" to the design below, exactly, it is for initialling M. B. & Co's envelope stamps - I have drawn it exactly as it will come on the stamp. 71 Wire. Allow sufficient space between the matrix & clearing plate to take 3 or 4 thickish envelopes. Yours J. L.(?) Sloper."

The inscription on the envelope reads: *Envelope - showing the way of the stamp - and how it is read*

The letter gives us an insight of how M0540.02 - 20-01-70 was made and as can be clearly seen the perfin impression was made from the side of the envelope and that 3 or 4 envelopes could be perforated at a time. We know that Sloper also directly perforated postal stationery for customers as their requisition forms include postcards and wrappers – but not envelopes. We also know that the service was provided by other perforators. Figure 2 shows an advert for Waterlow & Sons perforating services which included postal stationery. Similarly the requisition form from W. L. Kenny includes wrappers and postcards but interestingly again does not include envelopes. Francis A Hancock adverts however included the full range of stationery – postcards, wrappers and envelopes.

Many questions still need to be answered. Did Sloper provide perfinned stationery or were they just produced from private machines supplied by the company? Did companies always have separate machines for stationery or did they sometimes try to use the machine that they used for stamps? Who produced perforated envelopes for Army and Navy Co-operative Society?

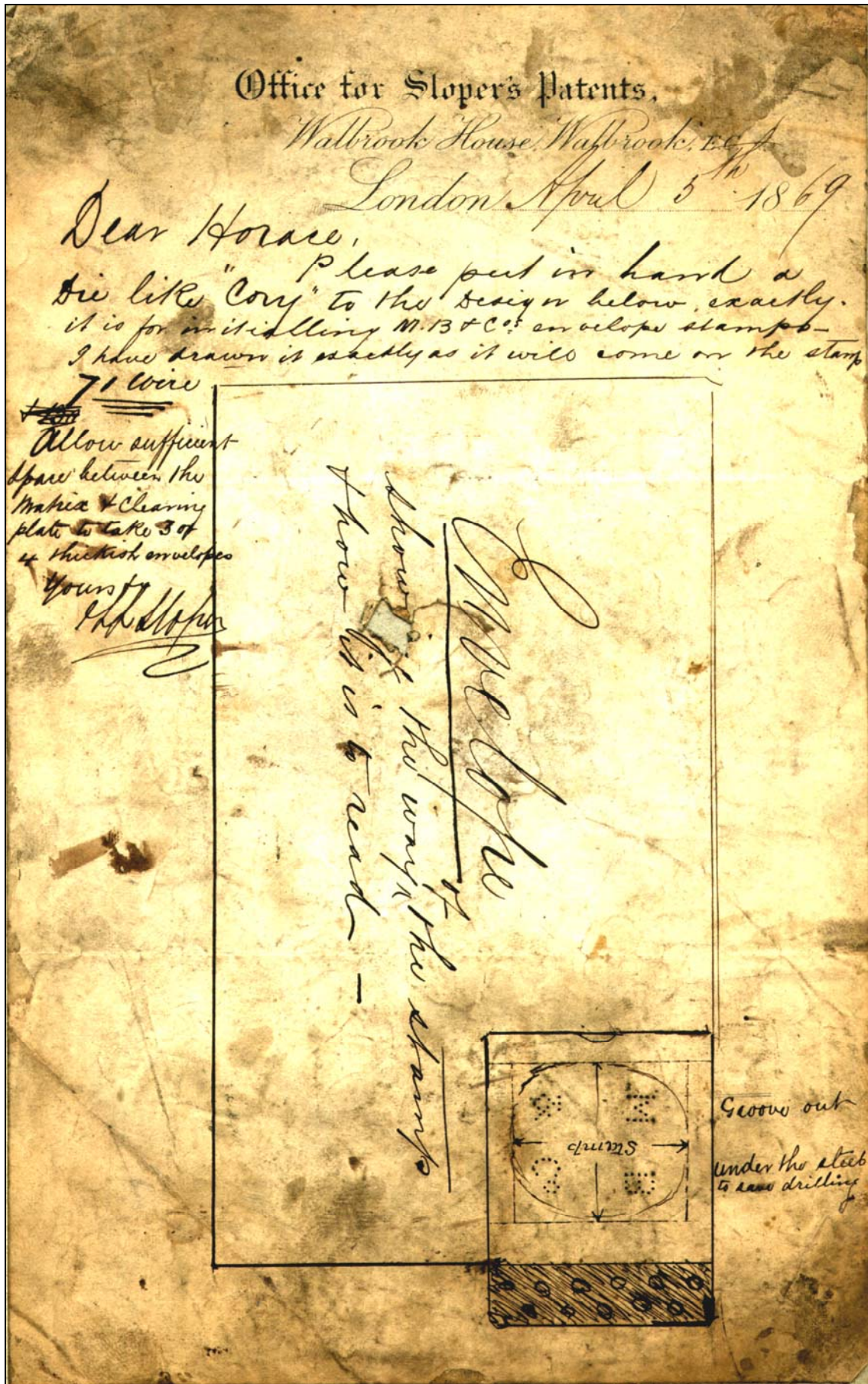


Figure 1 – Page from the Sloper Orders & Impressions Ledger

Perforation of Postage Stamps

FOR PREVENTION OF FRAUD AND EMBEZZLEMENT.

Extract from "Post Office Guide."

"In consequence of representations made to the Post Office by various Firms that there is reason to believe that their postage stamps were purloined by persons in their employ, the Department has recommended that the initials of Firms, &c., be perforated through the stamps by means of a machine devised for the purpose, and Postmasters have been instructed not to purchase such stamps."

WATERLOW & SONS LIMITED have prepared Machinery by which they are enabled to perforate the initials of Firms, Companies or private Traders on all kinds of Postage Stamps.

Stamps so perforated are secured from misappropriation, as they cannot be purchased by Postmasters or used for Savings' Bank forms.

CHARGES FOR PERFORATION.

If less than 12 sheets are ordered, a minimum charge of **2 4**
 If 12 sheets or upwards, per sheet **1 0**
 and Sixpence to cover Registered Postage.

Post Cards and Wrappers, per 1,000 **2 0**

The above charges include the use of stick Dies, such as "E. A. S.," "S. & G.," or any combination of three letters. Any greater number will require the preparation of a special Die, which would have to be charged to the customer.

CHAPTER 2**POST CARDS & REPLY PAID POST CARDS**

Postcards were first introduced in Austria on the 1st October 1869. There was public pressure for a cheap means of sending printed matter, newspapers and this eventually resulted in stamped postcards and wrappers being introduced on 1st October 1870. The public use of postcards far exceeded what the Post Office had expected resulting in cards passing unstamped through the system in the early days. The Post Office explored the use of perforating devices to cancel the postcards and these cancels are covered in Chapter 8 of this publication.

The earliest perforated postcard that has been reported was used March 2nd 1872 with perfin die Mcl - M1280.01a. At this stage companies were improvising by using their multi-headed dies used for stamps on this newly issued postal stationery. Later, companies would invest in single headed perfin machines dedicated for use on stationery. Almost invariably Post Office issue cards were used by the various companies. Only one example of a stamped to order postcard has been recorded to date. Although stamped postcards continued to be issued into the present reign no perforated King George VI or Queen Elizabeth II items have been reported

There are fifteen different pre-printed stamps on the known perforated cards. The Type number as used in this catalogue is shown along with the stamp type number shown in the Huggins catalogue. They are:-

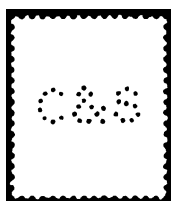


QUEEN VICTORIA**Post Cards with Type 1A or 2 – Queen Victoria ½d Brown stamp**

CHAPTER 3

NEWSPAPER WRAPPERS

Stamped newspaper wrappers were issued by the Post Office concurrently with the first post cards on the 1st October 1870. The earliest recorded perfined example is March 10th 1876 with a STOTT/&Co design. However it should be noted that most wrappers were cancelled with NPB cancels that show no date of use. Earlier use of perfined wrappers almost certainly exist. Private and stamped to order wrappers were used but no effort has been made to differentiate stamped to order wrappers in this listing.

From information to date there seems to be eleven (11) major different pre-printed stamps which are on the Post Office issued wrappers that were then perfined for various users:- Five (5) for Queen Victoria wrappers; Three (3) for King Edward VII wrappers; Three (3) for King George V Downey Head wrappers. In 1917 the King George V Typographed type head was issued on a wrapper. No wrappers were issued for King Edward VIII or King George VI although there are 'Stamped To Order' wrappers for King George VI.

Perforated Newspaper Wrappers are by far the most widely used items of Perforated Postal Stationery. Very few wrappers have printed identification of user on them: a few have hand-stamp identification. Quite a number of recordings are from cut-outs only and for this reason it is important that full wrappers are examined and any clues to identification, date, die or postmark are reported.

Where an identity is shown the identity is from the Society's entry in the Gault Catalogue. It has NOT been found on an identified wrapper.

Where the perfin has been found on a cut-out stamp only, this is denoted by an asterisk - '*'.

Where there is a 'C' in the 'Latest' column this denotes a die taken from The Cinderella Philatelist. Many of the illustrations in the original articles were not accurate and wherever possible confirmation of die number and other details has been made from later reports.

Where there is a 'J' in the 'Latest' column this denotes a die taken from Jennings' book, details of which I have found are not always accurate. Later research has corrected some earlier assumptions made in this book.

NEWSPAPER WRAPPERS

Newspaper wrappers were introduced on 1st October 1870 at the same time as post cards. Both private and official wrappers stamped at Somerset House were available. There are eleven different pre-printed stamp designs on the known perforated Newspaper Wrappers of Queen Victoria, King Edward VII and King George V that are found perforated by companies.

CHAPTER 4**ENVELOPES**

Post Office envelopes were introduced with the introduction of penny postage in 1840. Classifying envelopes as Post Office issues after 1855 is difficult as apparently identical envelopes were marketed by De La Rue for sale to the public who sometimes had them stamped to order at Somerset House.

The records of perforated envelopes catalogued here have in general not differentiated between Post Office issues and STO issues and this listing does not attempt to make that differentiation. Where information is recorded on whether the perforation passes through the whole envelope that has been recorded.

There are thirteen different types of stamps perforated on Postal Stationery Envelopes from the reigns of Queen Victoria, King Edward VII, King George V & VI that have been identified.

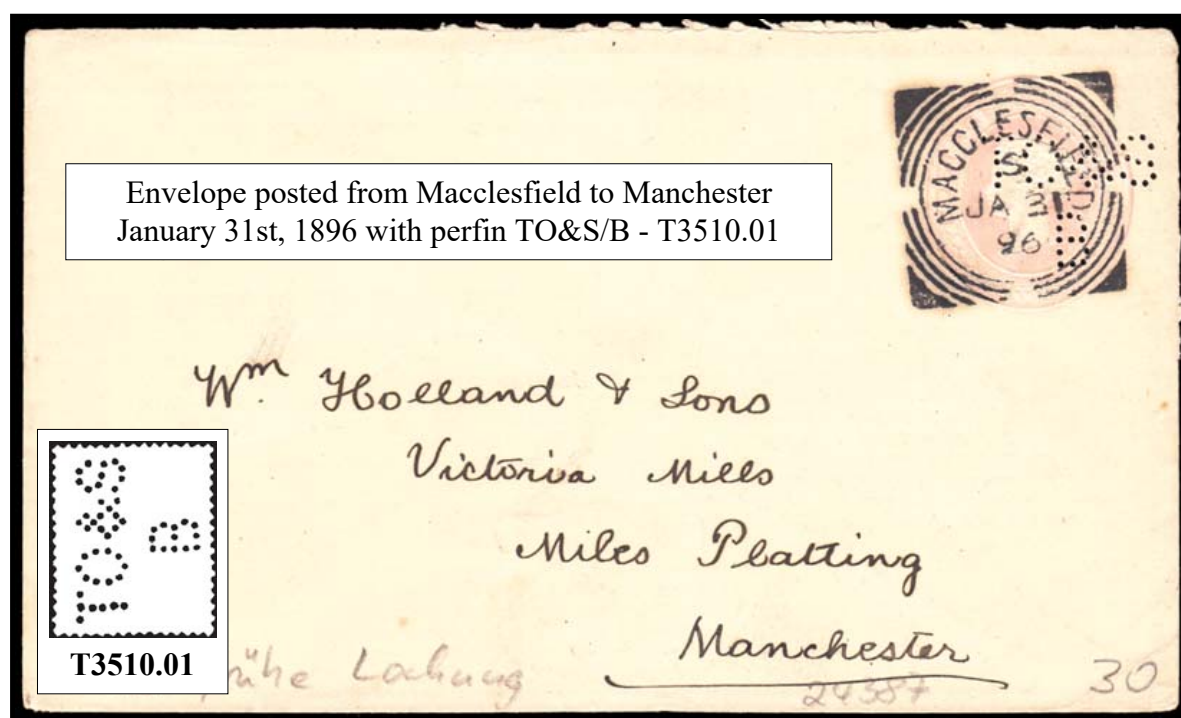

There are two variations of the Type 1 embossed stamp with a difference to the pendant curl at the back of the head, but no attempt has been made to differentiate between these two types in this survey.

Perfined stationery envelopes are probably the hardest group to understand when considering how perfins were applied to the impressed stamp. Some companies simply purchased Post Office envelopes and then applied the perfin to the stamp, which passed through the whole envelope. The vast majority of the perfins listed here are of that type. However envelopes from the Army and Navy Co-operative Society are perfined only through the stamp and not through the back of the envelope. It must be assumed that these are stamped to order envelopes where the envelope paper was impressed at Somerset House, then the perfin was applied and finally the envelope was made up. This extended procedure was obviously only used by companies with a high demand for envelopes such as the Army & Navy Co-operative Society.

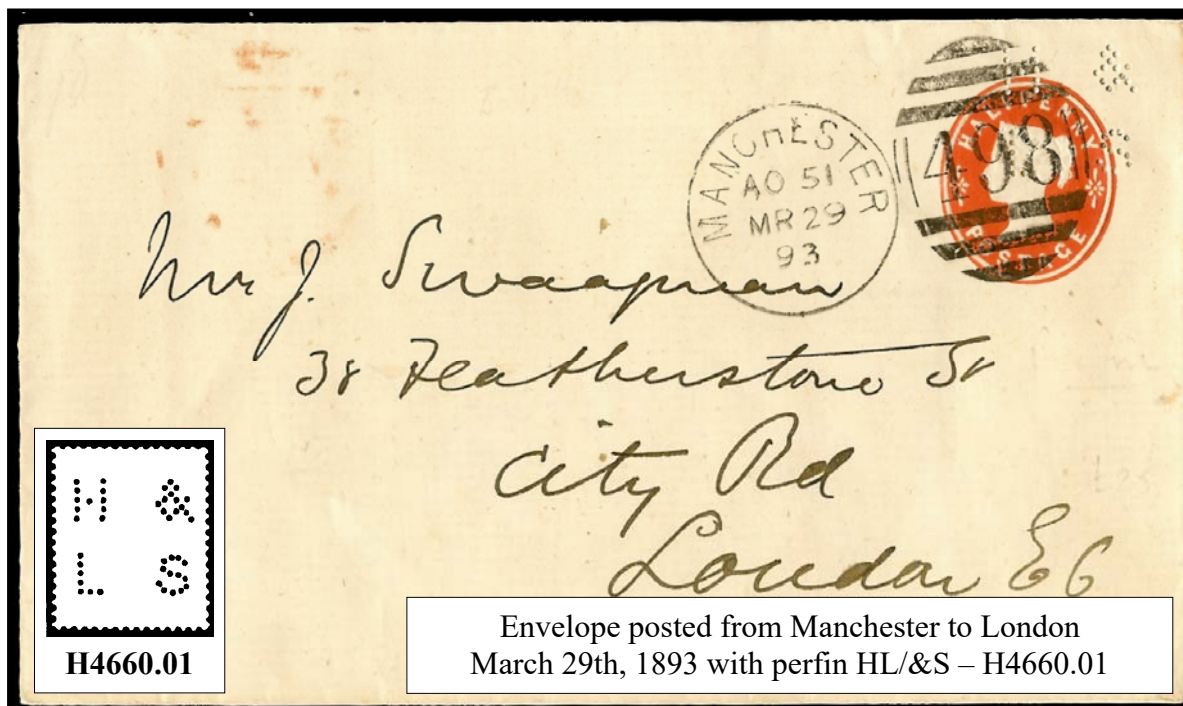
The envelope shown below is a typical example as the perfin is made through the complete envelope by a single headed die.



When Michael Lockton reported an envelope perfined with J.C&S – J1680.01 cover he wrote,

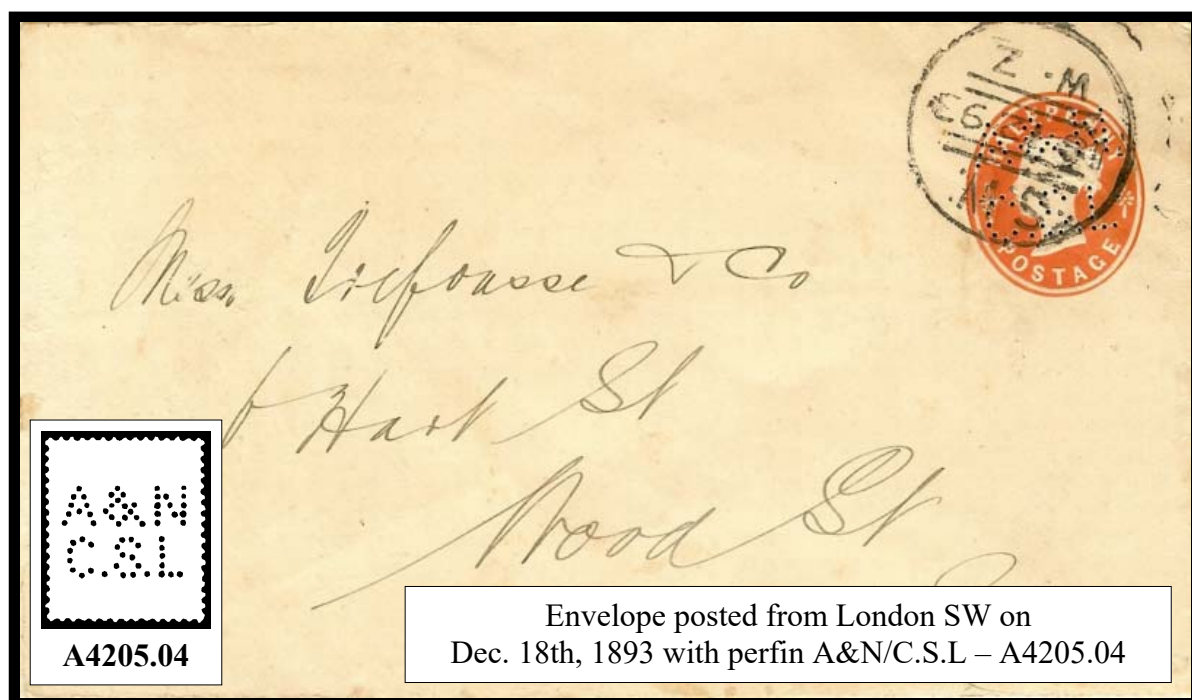
"The perforation is on a Post-Office envelope, type (Huggins) EP 31b. This is perforated through the stamp and the back of the envelope. I am unable to explain why this is not so with the A&N/C.S.L envelopes. If the envelopes had been of the 'Stamped-to-order' type this could have happened as Somerset House would have returned the stamped unfolded sheets to the customer but the envelopes identified are Post-Office issue and would have been supplied folded and gummed unless the Army & Navy had a special contract (which I consider unlikely). I think that I must favour the theory that the perforating machine had a long foot that went into the envelope."

The practicality though of trying to perforate the stamp on an envelope that has already been made up is hard to imagine. So the possibility that the perforation was made prior to the envelope being gummed and folded must still be considered a real option.



These two envelopes have been perfined by two different methods. The envelope above with perfin H4660.01 – H&LS is perfined through the stamp and envelope. However the envelope below, used by the Army & Navy Co-operative Society has been perforated with A4205.04 – A&N/C.S.L but the perforation only passes through the stamp.

It has been proposed that a long reach single headed die might have been slotted into the envelope and the perfin made. However this seems to be a difficult and slow process. It would clearly have been quicker to simply perforate straight through the envelope. However all copies with A&N/CSL perfins have only been perforated through the stamp. It seems much more likely that the perfin was made during the production of the envelope.



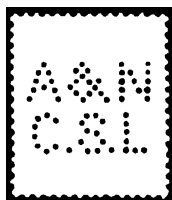

The King Edward VII example of F3460.06v - FR has been reported perforated only on the front of the envelope, the flap of the envelope is at the opposite end to the perforation. This report came via a member of the Cumbria P.S. and he wrote in "The Cumbrian Post".

"The fact that the holes do not go through the back of the envelope made me assume that the perfin was applied before the envelope was actually assembled, but E. L. Whitehead suggests his example was hand-done. Would they have a machine long enough to be put into this envelope to perfin the other end? Could my example be the long-arm type whilst the other (perforated all through the envelope and reported before) was a short-arm type?"

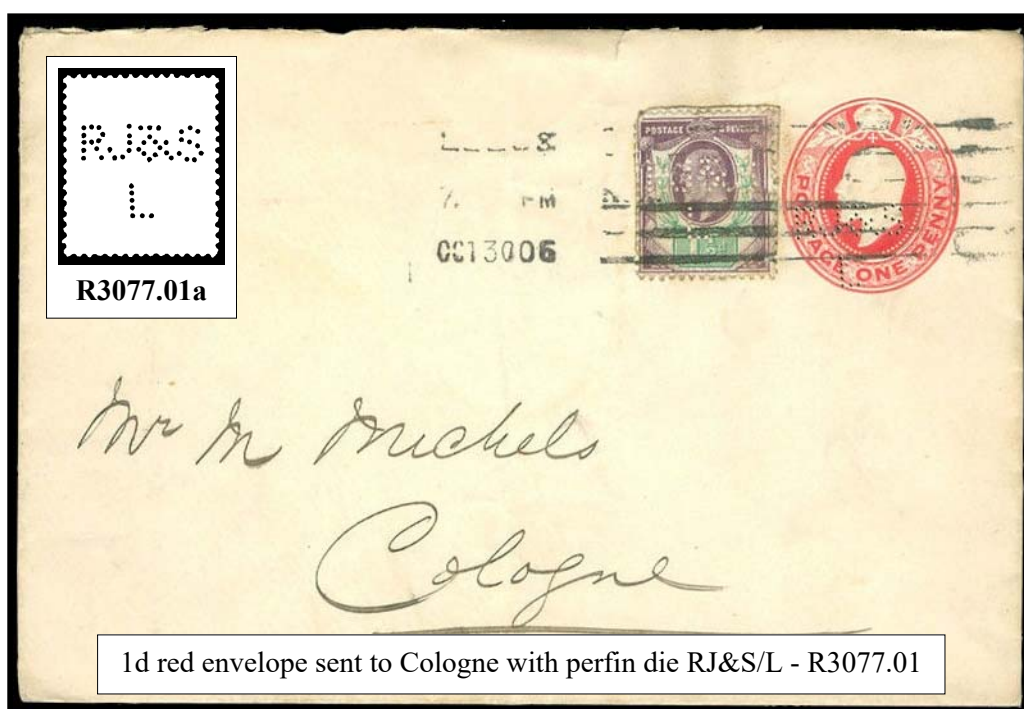

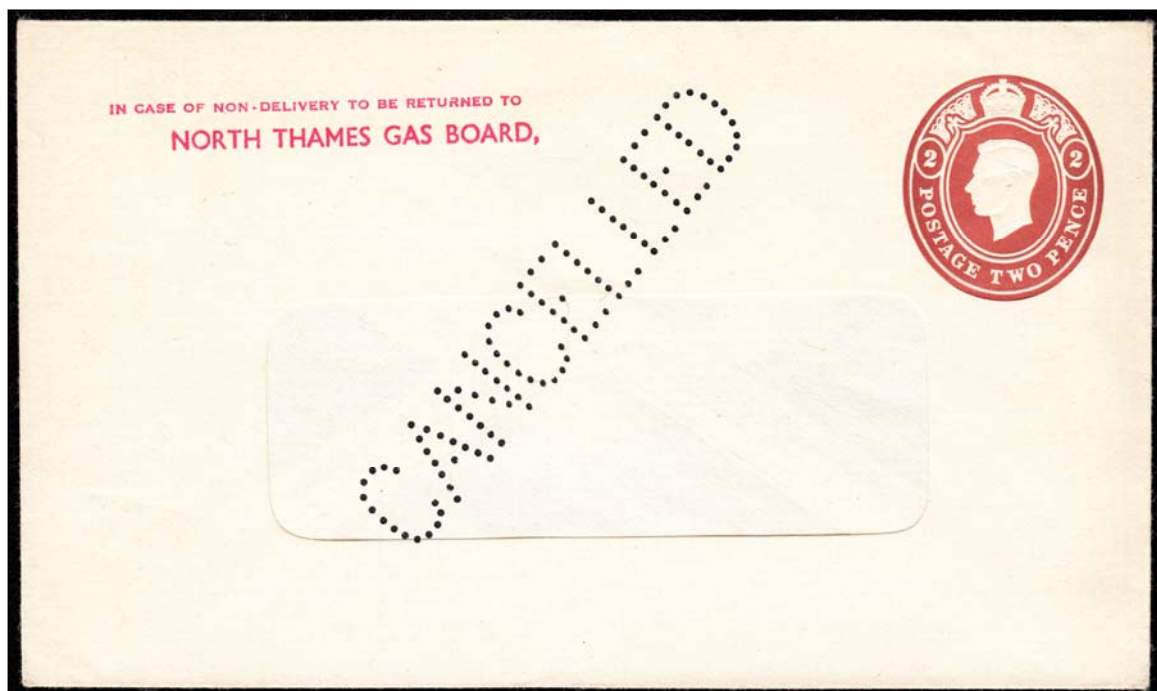
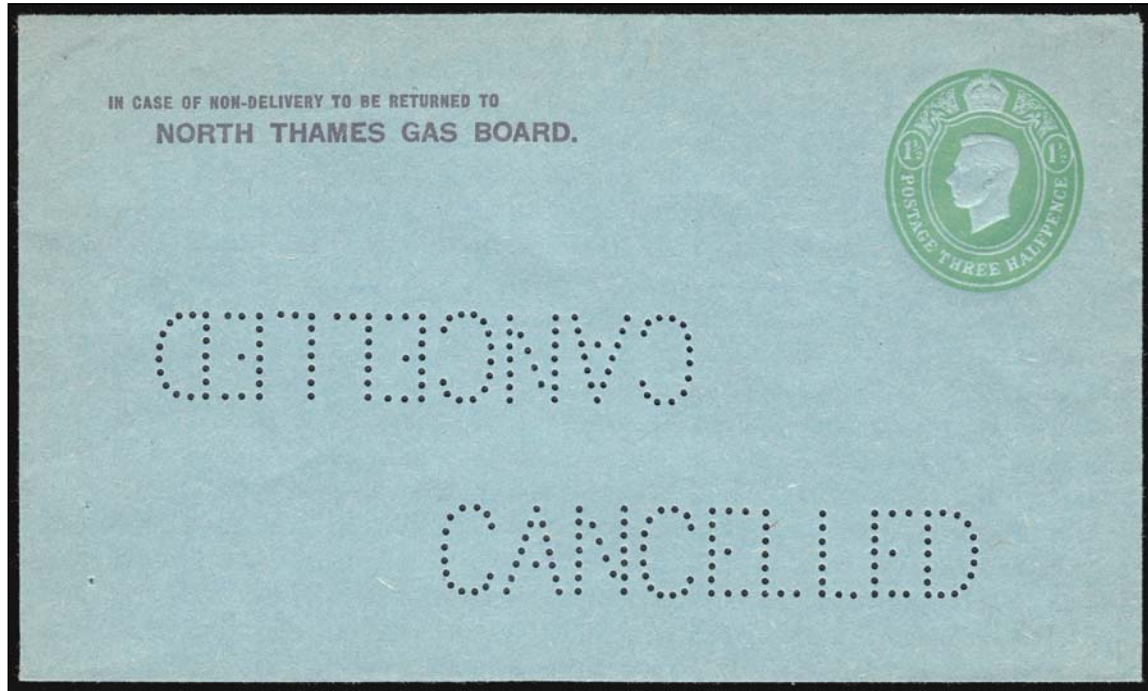
Fred Taylor has sent me a scan of the postal stationery envelope shown below. The envelope is stamped to order 2½d grey which dates from 1904. The imprint address of the company has been obliterated with a purple "CANCELLED" rubber stamp and the cover itself has been perforated with the word CANCELLED. Fred suspects that it is from a quantity of unused stamped envelopes that had been returned to the GPO for refund. The GPO refunded 17/6d in the £1 for returned stamps and it is presumed that this also applied to postal stationery.

The company imprint is for City Deep Limited, 120 Bishopsgate Street Within, London EC. City Deep was a gold mine in Johannesburg and presumably the London based company was established to raise capital for the mine. Inspection of London directories show that by 1915 the company had moved to 1 London Wall Buildings, EC so presumably the envelopes were returned for refund as the address was no longer correct.



KING GEORGE VI - CANCELLED ENVELOPES

In Bulletin 390 Fred Taylor showed a KEVII 2½d grey envelope which had been perforated "CANCELLED". **John Marriner** has now shown us two similar items on 1½d and 2d King George VI which were prepared for the North Thames Gas Board. Clearly someone who made these samples was worried that they could be defrauded of 3½d!



CHAPTER 5**REGISTERED ENVELOPES**

Registration of letters had been in existence long before the introduction of the penny post. A form of registration existed from 1787 till 1836. However with the introduction of the penny post registration as such was discontinued. At the same time the number of letters containing valuables increased, and at the same time the number of losses from the post. So registration was reintroduced in 1841 with a 1s. fee. The registration fee was steadily reduced, until by 1878 it was lowered to 2d and a compensation limit was introduced. This compensation only held in the case of money, if it was enclosed in the newly issued Post Office Registered Letter Envelope. As the envelopes were designed to contain money they were linen reinforced.

Perfined registered envelopes cover a longer period of use than any other type of stationery. The earliest recorded use in 1880 and the latest being a hundred years later in 1981. All registered envelopes had the stamp impressed on the flap of the envelope so in general it was relatively easy to apply the perfin through the stamp using an existing machine that the company owned. However, occasionally the perforation was made through the whole envelope.

Registered Envelopes which have perfins are relatively difficult to find. However the most common user, the Army & Navy Co-op Society is found on a regular basis.

This Registered Envelope illustrated below is a rather unusual item. It has the regular 2d blue Type 1 embossed on the centre of the flap. However the envelope has been perforated all the way through from front to back in the top right hand corner where one usually sees a stamp. The perfin is "YCO" (Y0180.02) but on the front of the cover are two 1d lilacs plus a ½d vermilion Jubilee all perfinned "YC/ & O" (Y0190.02). "YCO" is believed to have been used by Young, Carter & Overall, clothing manufacturers and warehousemen who were based in London EC. The cover is dated December 4th 1893 and cancelled front and back 'London Chief Office EC/Registered' in a purple oval.

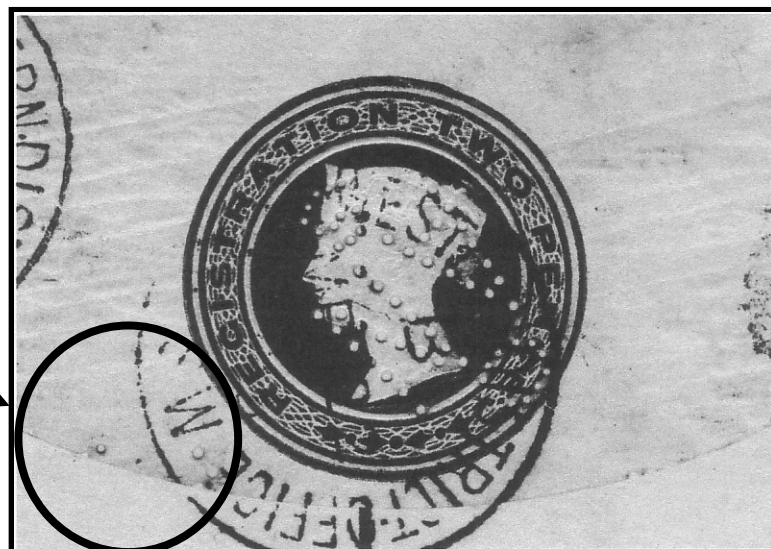
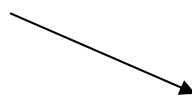

As previously mentioned companies would sometimes use an existing perforating machine to perforate registered envelopes and on occasions the machine was a multi-headed machine.

The illustration shown below is from a 'Huggins RP 20 Gc' (the P.P.S. identification number of a particular item of stationery). It has perfin C0270.01M through the Queen Victoria 2d Blue impression and C0207.03M through the adhesive. The interesting point is that on close examination of the flap, holes from two other dies on the multi-die head can be seen. This was always a risk when companies used an existing multi-headed die to perforate registered envelopes.



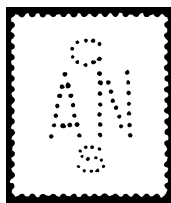
Sign of second impression from the multi-headed die

Below is illustrated a King George V 3d Brown Registered Envelope with perfin die R&Co/Ld – R1080.03 – through the embossed stamp. (This die is also known through P.S. Envelopes). However, this Registered Envelope also has a 1d KGV Red embossed stamp on the flap, also perforated through with R&Co/Ld. Both perfins are made through the flap of the registered envelope only and with their relative alignment appear to be from a multi-head die.

The perfin die was used by Rowntree & Co. Ltd., Confectioners, York and is known used between 1905 and 1936. This envelope is dated 09-08-20 and is cancelled at York. In 1920 some of the old stock of King George V 3d brown embossed Registered envelopes from 1912 were updated in price by adding a further 1d embossed value in red. (Huggins RP32).

At the same time Forces Registered envelopes were also updated. Forces registered envelopes were only stamped with payment of registration as postage was free for members of the forces. So a 2d orange stamp was added to the registered envelope to pay postage. Only one example of these envelopes has been recorded.

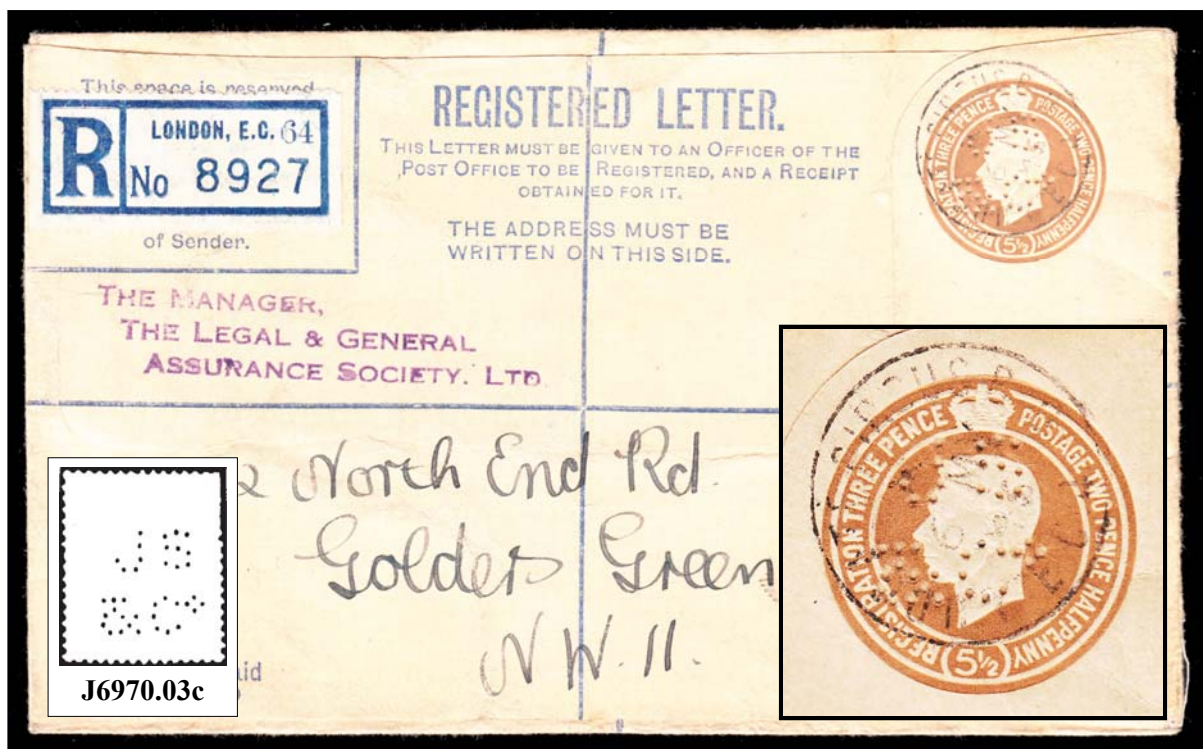
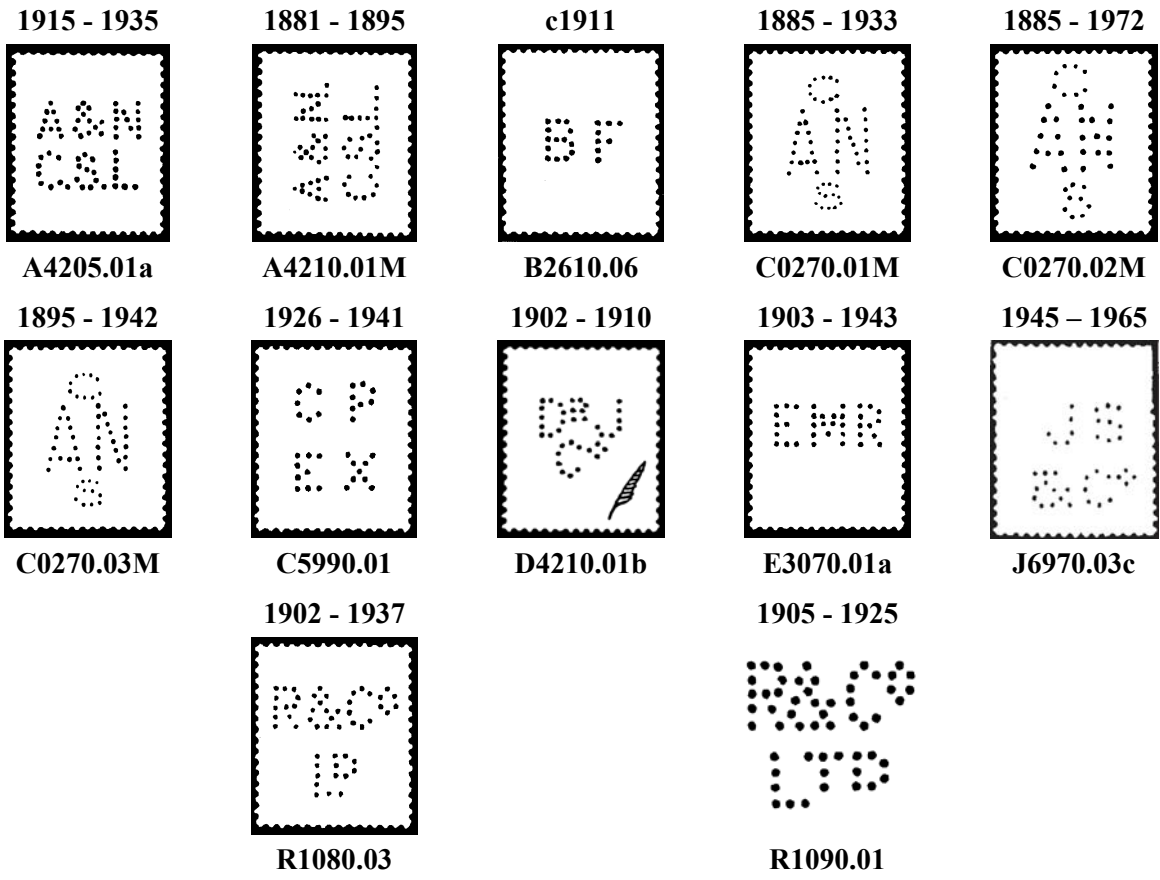

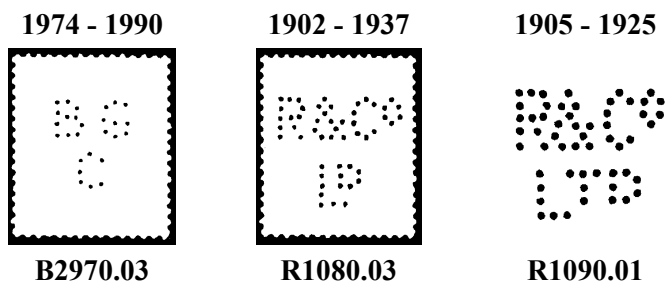

CHAPTER 6**AIR LETTERS**

Great Britain was the first country in Europe to issue a pre-stamped air letter sheet on 21st July 1941, although this issue was specifically designed for prisoner of war mail and designated "Air Letter Cards" by the Post Office. The first British issue for normal worldwide use was made in June 1943. In 1948 the first commemorative air letter sheet was issued for the Olympic Games, while in 1963 the first pictorials featuring London views appeared, and these have been followed by a variety of Christmas and various commemorative issues. The earliest example of an air letter perfinned is April 13th, 1948.

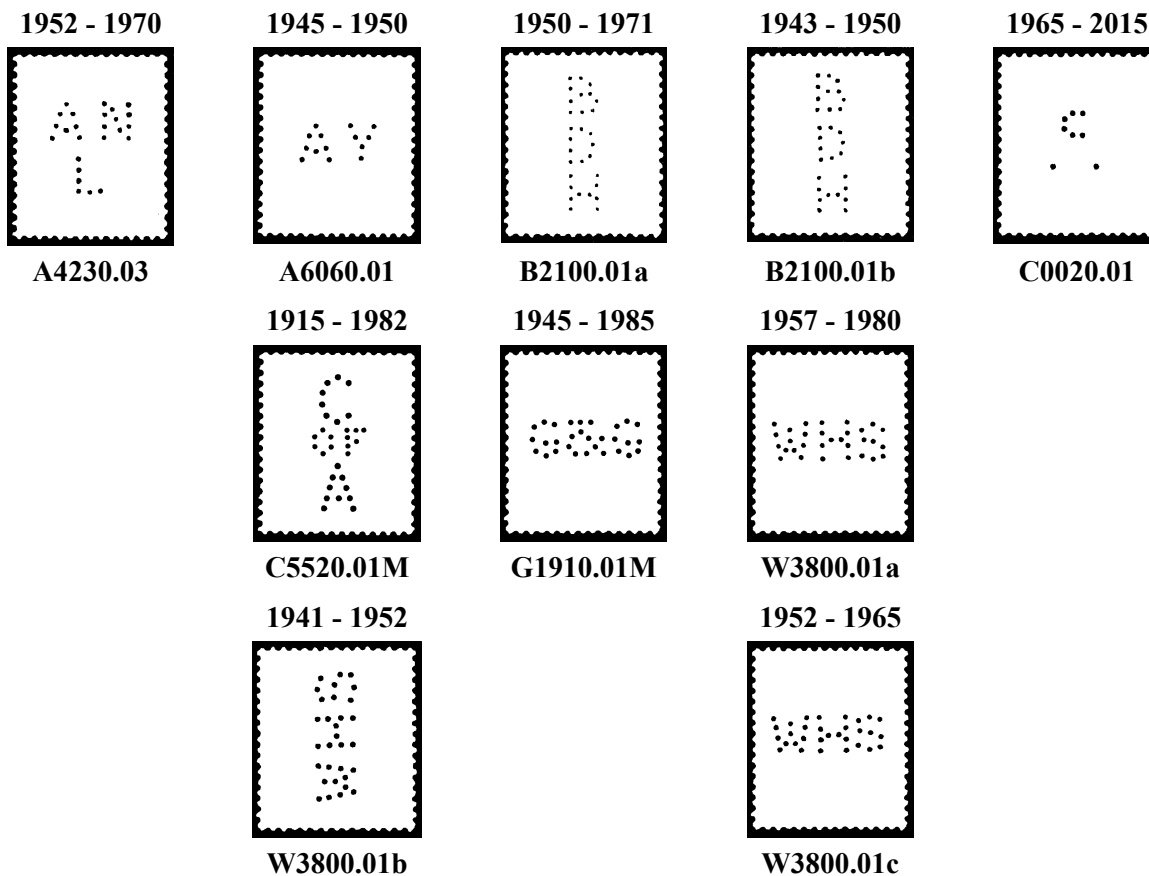

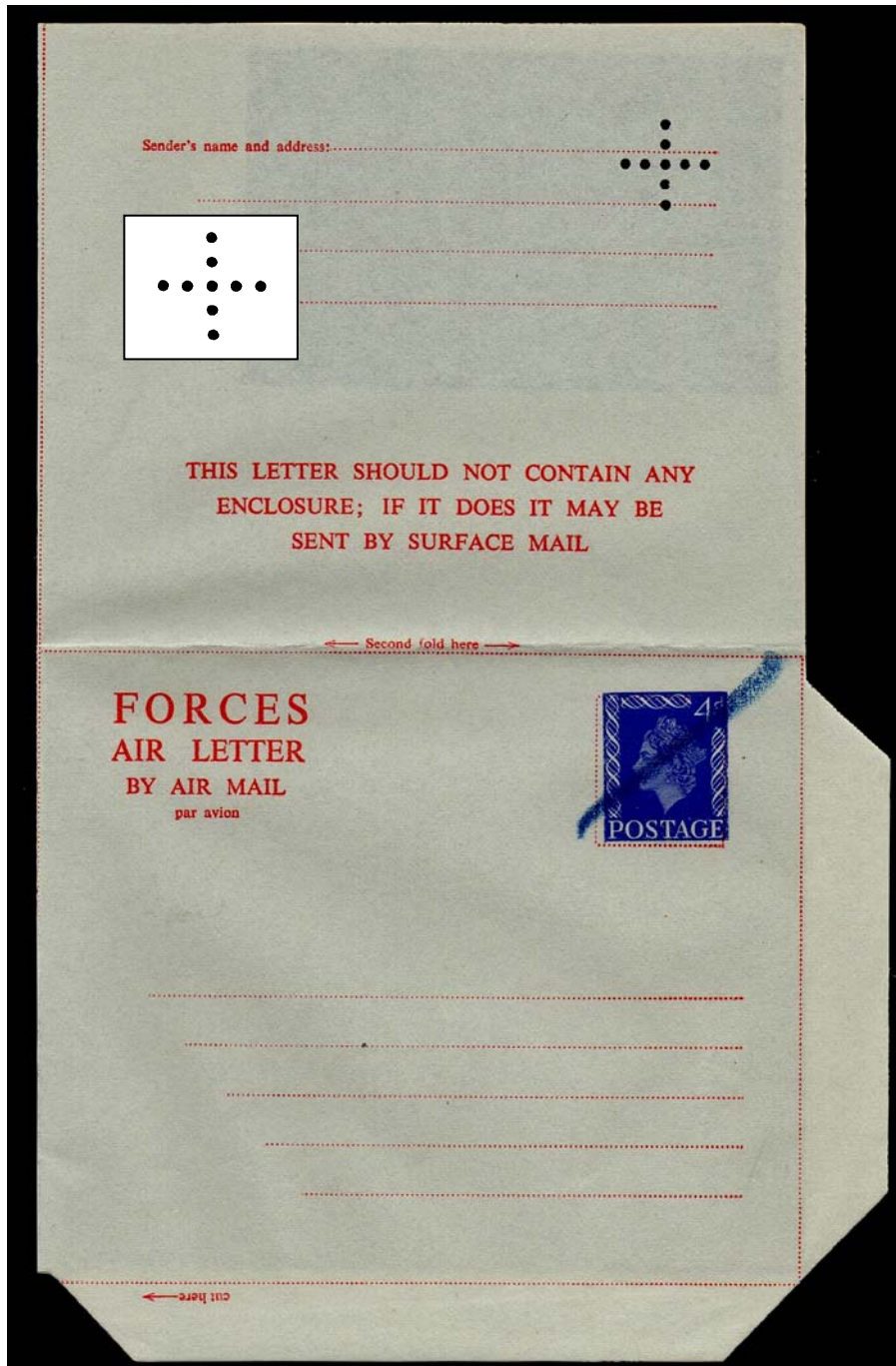

FORCES AIR LETTERS

A rather intriguing Forces Air Letter Form is illustrated below. It is mint except for a blue crayon mark slashed across the 4d Queen Elizabeth II stamp. The interesting thing for perfin collectors is the large “Cross” design perforated in the top right hand corner by the side of the space for sender’s name.



[Ed:- The illustration of the Air Letter is reduced in size, but the “perfin” die is shown full size.]

The opinion is that these forms were incorrectly stamped to order in the red box as they should have been stamped to the left, away from it. The blue crayon is probably a cancellation of the stamp by the stamping office and the perforated cross is possibly some similar identification by the stamping office, although why it is in that position nobody is quite sure. These forms (Forces Air Letters) were given out to the public free of charge, so any spoilt forms did not have to be paid for by the stamping office - unlike normal stamped to order stationery.

The forms were returned to the person who ordered them simply to show why the order had not been fulfilled, and possibly asking for another batch of blank forms to be sent to the stamping office. There are quite a few of these incorrectly stamped and then cancelled forms about, as several dealers' stocks have come onto the market in the last few years. It is thought that probably these air letters were stamped in batches of 100 and there are similar forms correctly stamped known.

CHAPTER 7
TELEGRAPH FORMS
QUEEN VICTORIA



Private Telegraph companies were taken over by the Post Office on July 31st, 1869. The Post Office then issued telegraph forms either singly or in books. This continued up until 1952. In general companies would have purchased books of forms to have a stock available and for security some of these companies seem to have perfinned the stamps on the forms, as the stamps could be cut out and used for postal purposes.

Below is shown a mint Queen Victoria Post Office Telegraph form with an embossed 6d stamp in the top right hand corner. The perfin through the stamp is A2820.01 AH/&C^o - 10,12/12,8,6 - 4½mm (IIIa). This die is known used on stamps with Liverpool cancellations. There is nothing on this form to indicate the user although it was probably used by A. Hanny & Co. – Cotton Brokers. The company had agents in Liverpool during this period.

The questions are raised:-

- 1) Was the telegraph perfinned on Post Office authority?
- 2) Was the telegraph perfinned by A. Hanny & Co?
- 3) Was the telegraph perfinned by McCorquodale & Co. Ltd., who printed the form?

The most likely answer to these questions was that it was probably done by the company. Whatever the answer, it would appear that anyone could perfin a document or stamp if they obtained a perfin die-stamp. The illustration of the Telegraph form is reduced in size.

The cut-out above has been listed as from a used telegraph form. However it is probable that it could have come from a stamped to order envelope as in 1906, 10d would have been the rate for a 4 oz letter to a foreign country.

There is another possibility. In 1905 it was once again permissible to use postal stationery cut outs stuck onto envelopes etc. to prepay postage. This had been prohibited since 1870. It is possible that James Mason & Son had a number of old Telegraph forms which they decided to salvage by cutting out the imprinted stamps and using them for paying postage on packages etc. This would account for a 'telegraph' imprint being found used (with a normal cancellation). Being a cut-out stuck onto a packet, it is likely to have been 'soaked off in the same way as any other (adhesive) stamps. Even this leaves the question: was the original telegraph form perfined or only the 'stamp' once it had been cut out?


KING EDWARD VII

Below is illustrated a King Edward VII Telegraph Form with G3400.02 - (GM/ & G) of Ginner Morton & Goddard, perforated through the embossed 6d stamp. The "5/12" at the bottom of the Form shows the Form was printed in May 1912. The printer is just noted as 'Wy. & S., Ltd.' which stands for Wyman & Sons Ltd. 74 - 76 Great Queen St, London WC. Unused copies of the McCorquodale & Co Ltd printing of this form are also known with this perfin.
