**DIRECTIONS TO SOUTHERN NH UNIVERSITY
 2500 NORTH RIVER ROAD, MANCHESTER, NH**


- 1. From the South (via I-93)**
 Take I-93N to exit 9N onto US3/RT 28 heading north to Manchester. At the first intersection, go left onto West Alice Drive, which becomes Donati Drive at the sharp curve. Follow Donati to the end, then go right onto Bicentennial Drive. Follow Bicentennial to the stop sign, then take a right onto North River Road. The university is 1/4 mile on the left.
- 2. From the South (via Everett Turnpike)**
 Take Everett Turnpike N (US Route 3) to I-293 North to Exit 6, Manchester. Cross the Amoskeag Bridge, then turn left onto Elm Street. Follow Elm for 1 mile, then turn left onto Bennington Road. Go 1 block, then right onto North River Road. The university is 1.5 miles on the left.
- 3. From the North (via I-93)**
 Take I-93S to exit 9N, Manchester. Proceed as #1 above.
- 4. From the East (via Rte 101)**
 Take Route 101W. After Exit 1, keep right to merge onto I-93N to exit 9N, Manchester. Proceed as #1 above.
- 5. From the East (via Rte 4)**
 Follow Route 4E to I-393W to I-93S to exit 9N. Proceed as in #1.
- 6. From the West (via Rte 101)**
 Follow 101E to I-293N to Exit 6. Proceed as #2 above.

A6 Water Safety For Childcare Providers ☆😊♥+

This presentation, approved by the New Hampshire Child Care Licensing Unit, qualifies New Hampshire based childcare providers to administer and supervise water activities for the children they are charged with. During this live, interactive presentation, we will discuss the state regulations as well as general water safety tips, how to recognize areas of concern around the water, how to recognize an emergency, basic rescue skills, and various other topics related to water safety. Upon successful completion of the course, participants are able to supervise water activities with their children.

Certification is good for 3 years.

A7 Period of PURPLE Crying Awareness ☆😊♥

Normal infant development includes a period of increased crying between 2 weeks and four months of age. This is known as the *Period of PURPLE Crying®*. When parents are educated and prepared for this phase, infants are safer. This presentation will increase awareness about this developmental stage of increased crying, ways to cope with it, and the dangers of reacting to the frustration that crying may cause. Parents are learning about this at 18 of NH’s hospitals when they give birth, reaching parents of over 95% of infants born in the state. It’s important for participants to be knowledgeable about this developmental phase, soothing techniques and frustration management techniques to support parent of infants.

It helps to provide support and seeks to empower families before crises occur.

This increases the likelihood that adults will respond to children's behaviors and questions in ways that communicate blame and shame. Nurturing Healthy Sexual Development is intended to give participants accurate information about children's sexual development as well as help develop the skills and comfort to promote healthy behaviors and respond to children's questions. Additionally, NHSD was created by Prevent Child Abuse Vermont as part of child sexual abuse prevention efforts. This is because there is an important connection between the way the adults in the child's life promote healthy behaviors using a non-shaming approach and a child's risk for abuse.
