

CALIFORNIA NONPROFIT WINS GRANT TO TACKLE THE GROWING PUBLIC HEALTH CHALLENGE OF DEMENTIA

Funds Will Support Scale-Up of Lewy Body Dementia Education and Caregiver Services

SAN JOSÉ, Calif., March 4, 2025 /PRNewswire/ -- The <u>Susan and Charles</u>
<u>Berghoff Foundation</u> announced receipt of funding from Santa Clara Family
Health Plan to support its education and outreach programs aimed at <u>Lewy body</u>
<u>disease and related dementias</u> (LBD). LBD is the second most common type of
dementia after Alzheimer's yet far less well known in clinical settings and less well
funded in terms of research.

Santa Clara Family Health Plan awards Board-designated Innovation Fund grant to Susan and Charles Berghoff Foundation to increase Lewy body dementia education for healthcare workers and support services to family caregivers.

The Santa Clara Family Health Plan Board-Designated Innovation Fund award of \$202,965 will support the Foundation's implementation of a focused initiative, entitled "Dementia Awareness and Response: A Place-based Model for Positive Impact," over an 18-month period through May 2026.

"It is an honor to receive this grant award from Santa Clara Family Health Plan," said Chuck Berghoff, Chairman and co-founder of the Susan and Charles Berghoff Foundation. "Dementia is a growing public health challenge in the US, with approximately one million new dementia cases expected *each year* by 2060. It is imperative to provide clear and accurate information about LBD and other common types of dementia and their causes, symptoms, treatment options, and resources for families. This includes families facing health and healthcare disparities, who are at higher risk of dementia, and lack access to dementia information and resources."

"These funds allow us to increase our impact on this public health challenge, providing <u>LBD-focused education programs</u> for healthcare professionals, pre-professionals, and communities; and practical resources for family caregivers."

"We are proud to support the efforts of the Susan and Charles Berghoff Foundation to expand outreach and education on Lewy body dementia to equip providers and support caregivers in the care of our members," said Christine M. Tomcala, CEO of SCFHP. "Through our Innovation Fund, the SCFHP Governing Board addresses gaps in serving our members' needs, and education and awareness of dementia is a fitting example."

As part of this commitment, SCFHP and the Susan and Charles Berghoff Foundation will explore opportunities for collaboration at the <u>SCFHP Blanca Alvarado Community Resource Center</u> in East San José and SCFHP's future <u>South County Community Resource Center</u> in Gilroy, slated to open late 2025.
