Covid-19 Requirements for Israel

Currently, Israel has lifted all Covid-19 related testing for entry into the country. Data has been pulled and compiled from official U.S. Embassy sites and international airlines for the most accurate and up-to-date travel information. We strongly encourage due diligence in verification of these travel requirements, as government protocols and mandates continue to change. **Abandon relocation to any country that mandates the VAXALINE(s).**

- It is not required to present a negative result on a COVID-19 test before boarding a flight to Israel, a cruise to Israel or before arriving to Israel at a land border crossing.
- The PCR testing mandate for those entering Israel at airports and maritime and land border crossings was lifted, and the isolation required until that test result was also canceled.
- A health insurance policy with coverage for the treatment of COVID-19 is required. The insurance policy is a mandatory to enter Israel.

Fill out <u>the entry form to Israel</u> during the 10 days prior your flight to Israel, your cruise to Israel or before arriving to a land border crossing to Israel:

- **Fill out your personal information** and details of those traveling with you, as well as information about the countries you visited the week before your flight to Israel, or before entering Israel at a maritime or land border crossing.
- **Present an entry statement form confirmation** before departing a cruise to Israel or before a land border crossing to Israel:

Both a digital and a physical copy can be presented. The confirmation must be kept until after the crossing in the border control in Israel, as it should be available for inspection if necessary.
