Category	Question	Answer
Accommodations	Where should I live?	Ideally you would want to live anywhere that offers you a month-to-month leasing agreement, as you never know when or how the Holy Spirit will move you.
Accommodations	What type of accommodation should I expect to find, live in?	There are a variety of different structures to live in depending on the country you choose. Be open minded to humble settings, such as huts, camps, smaller apartments etc. Also note, the tap water in the Middle East is considered non-drinkable. Be prepared to purchase all your drinking water in addition to paying for your water system.
Accommodations	What are typical housing/rent costs? How do I find housing?	Unfortunately, we cannot verify the accuracy of average housing costs as there are various variables that impact pricing locally at your destination. Unless you have a contact in the desired destination to secure a space for you, we recommend securing hotel or Airbnb accommodations for at least 2 weeks to 1 month in your destination while you investigate cost effective housing options. This will also provide an opportunity for you to learn different areas in the city to determine what best fits your needs. Locals, as well as hotel staff can be very beneficial in providing information about rental availability. <i>It's possible to find housing (1 to 2 bedrooms) from \$200 to \$350 USD (monthly)based on the testimony of those who already relocated to the region. Utilities may or may not be included.</i>
Clothing	How should I dress? Are there shops at locations to buy modest clothing?	In the regions within the borders, it is cultural for both men and women to dress modestly. As such, modest apparel is a common find in shops and clothing outlets in most areas you will find yourself in. It is advisable to purchase some modest undergarments (i.e., leggings, tank tops, t-shirts, etc.) as these are harder to come by, particularly in natural fabrics, and the material can be quite thin/see-through. Men and women often wear galabayes (tunics). The key is to blend in culturally as much as possible.
Clothing	What type of clothing/shoes do I need for the weather?	You will be moving to a desert region, and as such, the climate will be very hot. Staying cool and hydrated is important. Linen and cotton are the most ideal fabrics for the environment as they will allow your skin to breath. Men and women should consider wearing comfortable hiking sandals.
Covid-19	Should I take a PCR test?	It is a global travel requirement to produce a negative Covid-19 (PCR) test, apart from a few countries, to board an international flight.
Covid-19	Which Covid-19 test should I take?	We recommend home kits that can be ordered online and shipped to your direct address. We've compiled a list of some options <u>Here</u> .

Covid-19	How is the Corona virus affecting Egypt/Israel/Jordan?	Rapidly changing government mandates, closures and Covid-19 restrictions vary from country to country. For downloadable PDFs outlining Covid-19 requirements for Egypt, Israel, Jordan and additional bordering countries, go to the downloads portion of this site, <u>Here</u> . For the most up to date information for a specific country, <u>Click Here</u> .
Covid-19	How do I meet the 72-hour time requirement for my airline?	1. Make sure to order your test well in advance of your upcoming flight, i.e., multiple weeks ahead of time.
		2. Collect and return ship your sample to the lab 3 days before your flight. The "collection date" on your results will be the day/time you collected your sample and activated your kit. For example, if you collect on Monday afternoon for a Thursday morning flight. Make sure you drop off your completed kit before end-of-day pickup.
		3. Your results ideally will be ready within 24-48 hours after the lab receives your sample. This assumes no shipping delays. For example, if you ship your kit to the lab on Monday afternoon before end-of-day pickup, your kit should arrive at the lab on Tuesday – results will be ready on Wednesday or Thursday. Note: the company is NOT responsible for shipping delays.
		4. You will receive an email when your results have posted. Make sure to have them ready on your phone when you go to the airport. Download them and print the results as a backup.
Culture	Should I learn some Arabic? What type of Arabic should I learn?	It is wise to learn the language spoken by the people of the country you are travelling to. Arabic is the official language of the Middle East. The Arabic spoken across the Middle East differs from country to country. If possible, you can start to familiarize yourself with basic everyday phrases before your departure. You can find free language learning apps to help you learn the basics in a fun and engaging way. At the very least, start learning the form of Arabic widely spoken at your destination when you arrive. Consider signing up for <u>Duolingo</u> or <u>select here</u> to begin learning on YouTube.
Culture	How do I acclimate to the culture of 3rd world living? What are the people like?	One of the best ways to acclimate to a new culture is to learn the language and interact with the people. In general, people from the Middle East are known to be hospitable but are also known to hustle. Many live in poverty. Third world living is simple, humbling and refreshingly stress-free, and that is the life we are called to.

Family	What schooling options are there for school-aged children? Are there online programs for school?	Look into home schooling options (independent study programs, travel studies programs) in the US or your country of origin. Additionally research online schooling options. You will also want to inform your child's school with a travel notice. Depending on which country there are options to enroll your child(ren) in school.
Family	Do I need to have custody of my child(ren) to travel/leave the country?	To protect children in cases of abduction or custody disputes where noncustodial parents may try to remove them from the country, the Department of State requires both parents to appear in person with the child to apply for a passport. This applies to all children under the age of 16, who, along with their parents, must show proof of their identification. The Department also deny passports to those declared incompetent by a court or those who are currently in a mental institution. A legal guardian may apply for someone deemed incompetent. We recommend you have full custody or written consent filed through a federal court with a judge signature for any dependent child(ren) under the legal age of adulthood before your departure. This also includes paperwork for legal guardianship, divorce, and all other court ordered matters.
Family	How do I handle child support?	We recommend filing for child support prior to leaving your country of origin, and if possible, finalizing all court related processes. Any back-child support over \$2,000 (owed) will not be allowed to apply for a passport, if you already have a passport the IRS will revoke the passport for amounts owed over \$3000.
Family	What should I do if I have a disabled parent/child(ren)?	We would recommend traveling with appropriate equipment, i.e. wheelchairs, crutches, etc. As some of these items are difficult to access in foreign countries. Also consider that most northern regions are not handicap accessible, except for some major cities, so plan accordingly.
Family	What advice is there for women who are pregnant upon departure?	It is recommended that expectant mothers research local hospitals to give birth in advance. This may require hiring a translator to meet your needs. Also prepare baby needs before departure or upon arrival (i.e., stroller, crib, cloth diapers).
Finances and International Employment	How much money do I need to have to make the move? How much do I need to have saved prior to coming out?	Our recommendation is to have a minimum amount of \$3,000-\$5,000, with some plan to maintain an income (i.e., a job), apart from social securities, unemployment, child support, government stimulus, retirement, etc. Also note, any amount of USD exceeding \$10,000 (cash in hand) will need to be declared upon arrival in your destination.

Finances and International Employment	Should I even bring USD with me and how much? How do I go about exchanging USD to the currency of another country?	Yes, we recommend traveling with \$500-\$1,000. You can exchange your USD to foreign currency at the airport or at local ATM's. Exchange rates may apply.
Finances and International Employment	What do I do if I have unpaid debts or loans?	It is recommended that all your debts be paid before moving. However, if you're unable to, attempt to settle your debts for less than you owe, and if unable to, you can setup automated payments to be deducted from your bank account. This step should only be attempted if you have re-recurring income into that bank account. If you can pay larger lump sums, do so, to reduce your debt upon leaving. Be sure to maintain records of all your transactions.
Finances and International Employment	How much money do I need to survive?	It depends on the country of your choice and how frugal you live, as well as that country's currency. However, based on others testimony, roughly \$400-\$700 monthly (excluding Israel).
Finances and International Employment	Can I set up a bank account when at the destination, and why should I?	Yes. If you feel safer knowing that your funds are in the same place where you reside, also some countries provide more benefits if you have a bank account in the country (i.e., no fees and larger ATM withdrawals).
Finances and International Employment	What costs will I incur for day to day living: food, clothing, and shelter?	You will only know that once you arrive in the country of your choice.
Finances and International Employment	Should I keep my job?	Yes. We recommend seeing if your current employer offers remote work options or transfers internationally to the country of your choice.
Finances and International Employment	Are there any offline or online jobs available there?	Employment is hard to find for foreigners due to the language barrier and prejudice. Online opportunities are your best option, however, that will require personal research to find a job that meets your requirements.
Finances and International Employment	Are there any recommendations for online jobs or websites?	Options have been provided under the <i>Downloads</i> portion of this site, <u>Here</u> .
Healthcare	How is the healthcare for foreigners? Are hospitals and other medical facilities nearby? How easy is it to access local doctors and dentists?	All countries healthcare varies, we recommend researching the hospitals and medical assistance options for the country where you chose to relocate. If you have a major health issue or rely on continuous medication, we recommend confession and repentance before leaving your country of origin. It is important to wean yourself off any medication and pray that YHWH gives you strength through YAHOSHUA and His example of faith to walk this journey out committed to no longer defiling your temple.

Healthcare	Should I travel with any specific tools, supplements, food items, clothing, camping gear, etc.?	Any essential items you need on a routine basis should be arranged and secured prior to your departure and packed with your checked luggage to avoid removal during travel.
Healthcare	Is medical insurance any good in Egypt/Jordan/Israel? Should I keep my medical plan updated in the USA? Is there a specific type of healthcare package I should be traveling with?	Check with your current insurance carrier to see if they have international coverage, also consider the reoccurring fees associated with said plan and prepare to maintain your income to accommodate the charges if you chose to keep it.
Insurance	Is travel insurance needed?	In some countries travel insurance is required, however, we recommend securing travel insurance for at least 30 days.
Insurance	What travel insurance should I purchase?	You will need to research travel insurance to determine what best suits your needs.
Insurance	Should I keep my life insurance policy?	No. We recommend having a living will implemented before traveling to assure you have your affairs in order. Consider where you want to be buried, bank account information, and appointing a power of attorney.
Miscellaneous	How much information should I provide family and friends about my leaving?	Discretion is advised. It is understandable that in normal circumstances leaving your country of origin would warrant a 'going away' announcement, but under the circumstances of current events and rapid changes in worldwide laws and policies, it is necessary to exercise wisdom when choosing your emergency contacts. Wisdom is the principle thing.
Miscellaneous	What should I do if I have a(n) outstanding warrant(s) and/or criminal record?	The rules in the USA preclude only felons who committed international drug trafficking from getting a passport. The Department can, but doesn't have to, disqualify a passport applicant if he has been convicted of a misdemeanor (lesser) state or federal drug charge(s). Even if you have no criminal convictions, you may not get a passport. If you are currently charged with a felony or a felony arrest warrant is outstanding, your application will be denied. Likewise, if you are currently in jail or on parole for felony drug charges, you can't get a passport. The State Department can also refuse to issue a passport if you have an outstanding unpaid loan. The State Department will also deny you a passport if a court order, a probation order, or a parole order states that you are not to leave the country. Speak with a legal advisor to inquire about having some criminal offenses expunged. However, while an expungement keeps employers and the general public from seeing a criminal record, the record

		still shows up when the individual is traveling outside the United States. It is strongly recommended to research the laws of the government of your destination before traveling.
Miscellaneous	How do I know when it is really time to leave the USA?	Go over the prophetic lecture linked here to settle your next course of action within yourself. - <u>https://hisvineofwisdom.org/video-lectures</u> Blessed is the man who escapes before the wrath.
Miscellaneous	Why can't we go straight to the wilderness now?	We must first receive the Holy Spirit. Elohim is giving us time to prepare our hearts and minds, and to shed off our wickedness, so that we may be sealed with His Spirit before He gathers us into that secret place.
Miscellaneous	Can we go and live in the desert/mountains now like the Bedouins?	Yes. The locals will teach you to live Bedouin style if you choose.
Miscellaneous	What do I need to pack for the wilderness?	Hiking boots, fire starter, water, change of clothes, emergency tent and blanket, dried fruit, and food. Ultimately YHWH will provide all we need, somehow. Amen.
Miscellaneous	Child support arrears and passports	People who have unpaid child support arrears of over \$2,500 are not eligible for a U.S. passport. Before you apply for a passport, you must make arrangements in the state where the child support is owed to make the payments; if you have questions about the process or about what is owed, you should contact the nearest child support enforcement agency. The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services must remove your name from its list of outstanding arrears and give the U.S. Department of State an updated copy of the list.

Packing	How much do I pack and bring with me?	Look up the weight requirements according to your airline of choice. Consider packing your items in
	What should I bring with me to survive and live simply?	heavy duty bins, rather than suitcases. Though they may incur an additional fee, long-term they are ideal for organization and can double as storage. Stick to essential items where possible, i.e., undergarments, durable hiking shoes, clean fabrics (cotton and linen).
Packing	What items are important to bring that are not found/common in the region?	Any essential electronics (i.e., chargers, batteries) power converters. Hobby or work relate items (i.e., drill bits, tools, yarn, etc.) reading material (English). Undergarments for both men and women. Washcloths and essential vitamins or tinctures. *For women, we recommend bringing your own feminine products. Consider researching reusable product options.
Shipping	What items am I able to ship from America to Egypt/Israel/Jordan, etc.?	Each country has different regulations regarding shipping, based on container size, weight, and restrictions on items shipped. We recommend avoiding shipping any of the following items' oils, pills, electronics, and powders, Cosmetics on any kind (lip balm, nail polish, body wipes, sanitary napkins, etc.), any apparel, luggage or equipment that resembles military (camouflage) paraphernalia; as they may be held up in customs, incur additional charges and/or not be eligible to ship to or be released from your destination. If you believe these specific items are essential to your relocation, we recommend traveling with them in you checked luggage.
Shipping	Can I ship packages abroad?	Yes. The United States Postal Service (USPS) has international shipping options, as well as DHL, but there are other options available. Depending on what you want to ship will determine which option is best for you. We recommend researching the best shipping method for your country destination.
Telecommunications	How's the internet service there?	Keep in mind you are preparing to move to a third world county and the internet is not on the same level as the USA. There are internet providers, but you will have to do your own in-depth research on what company will serve your needs best.
Telecommunications	Will I be able to acquire a cell phone line?	Yes. There will be local service providers which you can investigate on your arrival. It is also recommended that you maintain a phone line within your state of departure (i.e., Verizon, T-Mobile) to apply/certify for governmental benefits (i.e., unemployment) as some governmental sites are unable to authenticate IP addresses of outside countries.
Telecommunications	What cell phone and internet service options should I choose?	That depends on your destination - Provided is a list of service providers for various countries - <u>https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/List_of_mobile_network_operators_of_the_Middle_East_and_Africa</u>
The Borders	What area or countries comprise the borders?	Israel, Jordan, Egypt (South Sinai), Saudi Arabia, Yemen, Djibouti, and Eritrea

The Borders	Which country is more economical to live in?	We recommend doing your own research to determine which country will best suite your needs. Consider language barriers, cost of living, visa extensions/renewals frequency, etc. when conducting your search. You can compare cost of living, <u>Here</u> .
The Borders	Why go to one region over another?	The reasons can vary from case to case, ultimately the answer is subjective so due diligence in your individual research is required to answer this question in its entirety.
The Borders	Are some countries and locations safer places to go to than others?	Yes, in general active warzones should be avoided, and in-depth research should be done on the laws of the land of your choosing.
The Borders	What Is the wisdom concerning Africa since so many are flocking there?	Based on biblical prophecy, it is recommended that you stay in the Northeastern region of Africa, near to where the elect will be gathered.
The Borders	Are there any towns, cities, or regions I should stay away from when considering a place to live?	It is recommended that you stay away from the western region of Africa.
Transportation	Will I be able to purchase my own vehicle, or can I rent a vehicle to drive?	The country you choose determines allowance based primarily on citizenship. However, if available, purchasing or renting a vehicle will require an IDP (International Drivers Permit). You may apply for one at your local AAA department. Learn More Here.
Transportation	What is the average cost of transportation?	The average cost of transportation will vary on the country you choose to live.
Travel	What's the best airline to travel with? Are there specific airlines that are recommended over other airlines? What airport should I travel from?	We do not recommend specific airlines. It is advisable that you research airline options and their available accommodations including, but not limited to, the appropriate domestic and international airports to travel to/from.
Travel	What type of ticket should I book?	We recommend permanent relocation, that being said, to improve your chances of being granted an extended visa, it is advised to purchase round trip ticket(s). Round trip bookings may avoid questions and concerns with immigration at your destination country. We recommend that you purchase a separate return ticket that you can cancel upon arrival. Be sure to research refundable options for the return flight and be clear on refunding procedures prior to booking.
Travel	How do I arrange transportation from the airport to my destination?	Consider arranging transportation through the airline or arrival airport website or seeing if UBER is available in the country where you are traveling.
Travel	Is it difficult to travel locally when I arrive at my destination?	Taxis are common and usually available.

Travel	What's the best time to travel?	We recommend traveling Sunday through Wednesday to avoid traveling on the Shabbat.
Visa	What are the visa requirements?	Visa requirements vary from country to country, <u>Click Here</u> to begin your search.
Visa	What visa options are recommended?	We recommend tourist or travel visas. Also research extended visas and/or visa extension options.
