

American nationals are required to have a valid Jordan visa when entering the country. Information is not comprehensive, and individuals must conduct their own research.

### **Tourist Visa**

A Jordan Visa on Arrival is issued for a maximum of 30 days, and for a single entry.

If you want to stay longer, you must apply for an Embassy visa, which can be issued for double, and multiple entries and allows a stay of up to six months.


A Jordan Visa on Arrival for a **single-entry costs JOD 40**, which is approximately US\$56.

Once your visa is stamped, you can enter Jordan.

You can apply for a Jordan Visa on Arrival at the Aqaba Airport and Queen Alia International

Airport, as well as most border crossings **except King Hussein/Allenby Bridge**. You don't need to do anything else beforehand. Once you arrive at the airport/entry port:

- At the visa counter there are usually two immigration officers present. One will ask you questions regarding your trip, while the other will verify your documents and stamp your visa.
- Hand in your passport, return-trip ticket, hotel reservation, and pay the Jordan Visa on Arrival fee (JOD40). **Make sure you have the cash for the fee ready.**
  - A double entry visa costs \$97.50 (USD)
  - A multiple entry visa, valid for 6 months costs \$187.50 (USD).
  - A multiple entry visa valid for 1-year costs \$307.50 (USD)
  - A multiple entry visa valid for 5 years costs \$160 (USD).

Visa requirements can change at short notice and persons should contact their respective embassy or consulate for the latest details.

You cannot apply for a Jordan Visa online, only a Jordan Pass, which is sort of like a visa, in the sense that it will *waive* the visa on arrival requirement. The Jordan Pass is more expensive than a Visa on Arrival, but it will let you enter without a fee at multiple tourist attractions in Jordan, which ends up paying for itself.

### **Visa Extension**

If you want to stay longer than your visa's validity in Jordan, you must register at a Jordanian police station before the visa expires. If you have a Visa on Arrival, you will likely receive a 60-day extension. If you have an Embassy visa, you can extend your stay for another six months maximum.

If you do not register with the Jordanian police, and instead just overstay your visa you will have to pay a fee during departure. The fee is calculated based on the number of days you have overstayed – approximately US\$2 per day. Basically, this means you'll be charged 45 JD for each month you pass the visa limit. Fine is payable when you extend, or on departure from Jordan at a counter just before immigration at Queen Alia International Airport in Amman.

### **Student Visa**

To get a student visa for Jordan, prospective student is required to file an application with the Jordanian Ministry of the Interior for Annual Residence Permit for Studying in the Jordanian Universities and Academics.

- Non-Jordanian students must first obtain tourist visa to enter country, which is then converted to a residency permit for one year (though students who are US citizens may opt to purchase the five-year visa if they wish).
- Single-semester students may obtain a five-year (US citizens only) or six-month (EU and others), multi-entry visa from the consulate in Washington D.C. or the [consular office](#) nearest before travel to Jordan.
- Once obtain residency permit, student(s) can exit and reenter the country without obtaining a new visa. Read more [here](#).

### **Permanent Residency**

Investors can get immediate citizenship or permanent residency if meet one of these requirements. 1) Deposit or make an investment of \$1.5mn -\$2.5mn with the Jordan central bank interest free over a 5-year period; or 2) buy property for at least 200,000 JOD for 10 years without selling.
