Fools Card:



Meaning: The Fool represents new beginnings, having faith in the future, being inexperienced, not knowing what to expect, having beginner's luck, improvisation and believing in the universe. **Upright card (keywords):** Beginnings, Innocence, Leap of faith, Originality, Spontaneity

Reversed card (keywords): Chaos, Folly, Lack of direction, Naivety, Poor judgement, Stupidity

• The Magician:



Meaning: When the Magician appears in a spread, it points to the talents, capabilities and resources at the querent's disposal to succeed. The message is to tap into one's full potential rather than holding back, especially when there is a need to transform something.

Upright card (keywords): Determined, Dexterity, Resourceful, Skilled, Strong powerful man

Reversed card (keywords): Communication blocks, Confusion, Deceit, III intentions, Lack of energy

• The High Priestess:



Meaning: High Priestess is a card of mystery, stillness and passivity. This card suggests that it is time to retreat and reflect upon the situation and trust your inner instincts to guide you through it. Things around you are not what they appear to be right now.

Upright card (keywords): Hidden talents, Intuition, Mystery, Spiritual insight, Things yet to be revealed

Reversed card (keywords): Information withheld, Lack of personal harmony, Secrets

• The Empress:



Meaning: The Empress is traditionally associated with maternal influence, it is the card if you are hoping to start a family. She can represent the creation of life, romance, art, or new business. **Upright card (keywords):** A new opportunity, Abundance, Maternal

care, Nurturing, Pregnancy, Stability

Reversed card (keywords): Domestic problems, Financial issues, Stagnation, Unwanted pregnancy

•The Emperor:



Inter-south

Meaning: This card is suggestive of stability and security in life. You are on top of things and everything in under your control. It is your hard work, discipline and self control that have bought you this far. It means that you are in charge of your life now setting up your own rules and boundaries.

Upright card (keywords): Authority, Father figure, Law and order, Leadership, Power, Promotion

Reversed card (keywords): Control freak, Immaturity, Lack of discipline, Loss of authority, Manipulative friends

•The Hierophant:



Meaning: Hierophant stands for tradition and convention. It can represent marriage in an arranged setup. It can also mean a teacher or counsellor who will help in learning / education of the querent. Upright card (keywords): Education, Learning, Marriage, Religion, Seeking counsel or advice, Spiritual guidance, Tradition Reversed card (keywords): Abuse of position, Breakdown, Poor counsel, Rejection of family values

•The Lovers:

Meaning: The Lovers represent relationships and choices. Its appearance in a spread indicates some decision about an existing relationship, a temptation of the heart, or a choice of potential partners. Often an aspect of the querent's life will have to be sacrificed; a bachelor(ette)'s lifestyle may be sacrificed and a relationship gained (or vice versa), or one potential partner may be chosen while another is turned down. Whatever the choice, it should not be made lightly, as the ramifications will be lasting.

Upright card (keywords): Being at a crossroads, Choices,

Commitment, Falling in love, Partnerships

Reversed card (keywords): Disharmony, Imbalance, Misalignment of values. Self-love

•The Chariot:



Meaning: The Chariot is a card about overcoming conflicts and moving forward in a positive direction. One needs to keep going on and through sheer hard work and commitment he will be victorious. **Upright card (keywords):** A journey, Ambition, Confidence, Drive, Overcoming obstacles, Will power

Reversed card (keywords): Lack of direction, Scattered energy, Self doubt

• The Strength:

Meaning: Strength predicts the triumphant conclusion to a major life problem, situation or temptation through strength of character. It is a very happy card if you are fighting illness or recovering from injury. **Upright card (keywords):** Confidence, Enjoying power, Inner strength, Potency, Self-belief, Virility, Vitality

Reversed card (keywords): Hedonism, Lack of self-control, Lacking courage, Self-doubt, Vanity

•The Hermit:

Meaning: The Hermit suggests that you are in a phase of introspection where you are drawing your attention inwards and looking for answers within. You are in need of a period of inner reflection, away from the current demands of your position.

Upright card (keywords): Introspection, Meditation, Self-reflection, Solitude, Soul-searching, Withdrawn from society

Reversed card (keywords): Exile, Loneliness, Misfit, Sadness, Withdrawing from loved ones

•The Wheel of Fortune:

Meaning: A common aspect to most interpretations of this card within a reading is to introduce an element of change in the querent's life, such change being in station, position or fortune: such as the rich becoming poor, or the poor becoming rich.

Upright card (keywords): Chance, Changes, Destiny, Luck, Opportunity, Winning

Reversed card (keywords): Bad luck, Disappointment, Misfortune, Mishap, Unforeseen setback

•The Justice:




Meaning: The Justice card indicates that the fairest decision will be made. Justice is the sword that cuts through a situation, and will not be swayed by outer beauty when deciding what is fair and just. **Upright card (keywords):** Balance and equilibrium, Cause and effect, Fairness, Justice, Responsibility

Reversed card (keywords): Dishonesty, Imbalance, Lack of accountability, Legal flaws, Unfair treatment

Meaning: The Hanged Man is the card that suggests ultimate surrender, sacrifice, or being suspended in time.

Upright card (keywords): Breaking old patterns, Circumspection,

Letting go, Metamorphosis, Suspension

Reversed card (keywords): Egotism, Inability to change, Missing an

opportunity

•The Death:



Meaning: Unlikely that this card actually represents a physical death. Typically it implies an end, possibly of a relationship or interest, and therefore implies an increased sense of self-awareness.

Upright card (keywords): Endings, Failure, Letting go of attachments,

Mortality, Profound change, Severe illness

Reversed card (keywords): Delayed endings, Depression, Living unaware, Long terminal illness, Resistance to change

Meaning: This card indicates that you should learn to bring about balance, patience and moderation in your life. You should take the middle road, avoiding extremes and maintain a sense of calm.

Upright card (keywords): Alchemy, Balance, Connecting with your guides, Harmony, Looking for divine intervention, Moderation

Reversed card (keywords): Disharmony, Imbalance, Lack of patience, Onset of illness

•The Devil:



Meaning: It represents being seduced by the material world and physical pleasures. Also living in fear, domination and bondage, being caged by an overabundance of luxury, discretion should be used in personal and business matters.

Upright card (keywords): Bondage, Enslavement, Fear, Feeling trapped, Materialism, Temptation, Unhealthy relationships **Reversed card (keywords):** Breaking from addictions, Divorce, Freedom from restraints

•The Tower:

Meaning: The Tower is commonly interpreted as meaning danger, crisis, destruction, and liberation. It is associated with sudden unforeseen change.

Upright card (keywords): Accident or damage, Catastrophe,

Destruction, Renovation, Unexpected change

Reversed card (keywords): Illness, Losses, Obstacles, Volatile situation

•The Star:



Meaning: When the Star card appears, you are likely to find yourself feeling inspired. It brings renewed hope and faith and a sense that you are truly blessed by the universe at this time.

Upright card (keywords): Astronomy, Good health, Hope, Inspiration, Opportunities, Spirituality

Reversed card (keywords): Despair, Disappointments, Illness, Missed opportunities

Meaning: The Moon is a card of illusion and deception, and therefore often suggests a time when something is not as it appears to be. Perhaps a misunderstanding on your part, or a truth you cannot admit to yourself.

Upright card (keywords): Deception, Difficult period, Fear, Hidden things, Insecurity, Mental confusion

Reversed card (keywords): Insomnia, Mysteries unveiled, Release of fear, Unhappiness, Unusual dreams

•The Sun:



Meaning: The card portends good fortune, happiness, joy and harmony. It represents the universe coming together and agreeing with your path and aiding forward movement into something greater. **Upright card (keywords):** Enlightenment, Joy, Marriage, Material happiness, Success, Vitality

Reversed card (keywords): False impressions, Lack of clarity, Low Vitality, Sadness

•The Judgement:



Meaning: This card is referred to as a time of resurrection and awakening, a time when a period of our life comes to an absolute end making way for dynamic new beginnings.

Upright card (keywords): Awakening, Decision making, Redemption, Reincarnation, Renewal, Transition

Reversed card (keywords): Poor logic, Poor or hasty judgement, Self-doubt, Stagnation

•The World:



Meaning: The World represents an ending to a cycle of life, a pause in life before the next big cycle beginning with the fool. It is an indicator of a major and inexorable change, of tectonic breadth. **Upright card (keywords):** Achievement, Fulfillment, Possibilities, Successful conclusions

Reversed card (keywords): Delayed success, Failed plans, Lack of completion, Stagnation

•Ace of Wands:



The Ace of Wands symbolizes a pivotal act or fateful step that will set loose the chain of events leading toward your desired goal. As such, it refers to a birth or new beginning, the initiation of an endeavor, and the necessary commitment to see a project through. When the Ace of Wands comes up in your Tarot reading, it indicates a time of inspiration and motivation, and you're encouraged to take a bold step forward.

•Two of Wands:



The Two of Wands represents the second step on your journey, when it's time to plan a real course of action. This may take you out of your comfort zone, but the Two of Wands calls on you to be realistic, think big, and look long-term. The Two of Wands is also connected to decision-making, and may imply a deadlock due to energies working at cross-purposes. You could feel "damned if you do, damned if you don't," or like you've bitten off more than you can chew. When the Two of Wands comes up in your Tarot reading, regain your bearings before you launch forward, and deal with your concerns ... before they become regrets!

•Three of Wands:



The Three of Wands symbolizes an inner balance that allows you to feel optimism about new endeavors you are committed to. When the Three of Wands arises in a Tarot reading, you must be patient and trusting. This card represents the energy a person needs to undertake great adventures and accomplish notable deeds. When the Three of Wands comes up in your Tarot reading, it is a reminder to look for opportunities, to be open and confident in your ideas and abilities, and to think big.

•Four of Wands:



The Four of Wands is a card of teamwork, with a focus on coming together to create something positive for the future. The energy of the Four of Wands is that of the start-up -- the founding visionaries committing their energies to laying the groundwork. If this card arises in your Tarot reading, you may be renovating your home, starting a community project, or getting married -- this is a card of foundations, and a reminder to celebrate big wins and small victories along the way.

•The Governess of Wands:



The Governess of Wands is a leader and a doer, whose gift it is to oversee all parts of a situation and ensure they are working well together. She has a charming, charismatic air about her and her energy is infectious. The Governess of Wands is both challenging and encouraging, and is set on getting things done and achieving goals. When this card arises in your Tarot reading, it's an indicator to put yourself out there, act with confidence, and to use your own skills of leadership and grace when dealing with others.

•The Governor of Wands:



The Governor of Wands represents the classic conquering hero. He's a charismatic leader -- entrepreneurial and ambitious -- and is always creating new adventures. He does this because sitting idly aside makes him restless and bored. The King of Wands wants to lead, not follow. He likes to be recognized and loved, and sit in the center of attention. This Governor showers those he loves with wonderful energy and charm, yet those who cross him will feel his wrath. When the Governor of Wands appears in your Tarot reading, find pride in yourself and your status, and use it to encourage others toward success.

•Ace of Cups:



The Ace of Cups shows a hand holding up an overflowing cup, which fountains forth an endless stream of refreshment and healing. It is an unfailing source of balm for body, heart, and soul, and represents fresh feelings. When the Ace of Cups appears in your Tarot reading, it suggests that you open your heart and relax into a safety net of love, support, and communion.

•Two of Cups:



The Two of Cups signifies a union of soul mates. It often refers to romantic relationships, but can indicate any partnership that is based on affinity and deep mutual understanding. This card highlights a karmic tie between individuals -- the point when two become one, and everyone wins. When the Two of Cups appears in your Tarot reading, put your focus on the closest relationship in your life, and nurture it in every way you can.

•Three of Cups:



The Three of Cups calls on you to celebrate the kindred spirits in your life. It implies a spirit of agreement, mutual support, encouragement, and teamwork. It reminds you that you belong to a group of like-minded people, and that there are great benefits to maintaining harmonious relationships. When the Three of Cups turns up in your Tarot reading, it asks you to realize all the support and understanding that is available to you. Reach out and reconnect with those closest to you.

•Four of Cups:



The Four of Cups refers to a restless time, when you have become dissatisfied with life and disappointed with where you now sit. Feeling stagnant and longing for change, your heart is questioning its options, and you may find yourself pulling away from the world. When the Four of Cups comes up in your Tarot reading, beware becoming so self-absorbed and ungrateful that you cannot even see the joyful opportunities that are right in front of you. A more open outlook can change everything.

•The Governess of Cups:



The Governess of Cups is the embodiment of femininity and emotion. She is an intuitive and sensitive soul who is supremely understanding and offers unconditional love. She is the classic "feeler," able to connect with situations and others on a very deep level. When

the Governess of Cups shows up in your Tarot reading, you are reminded to trust your inner feelings, and treat others with compassion, love, and support.

•The Governor of Cups:



The Governor of Cups is so deep that he doesn't even need to speak to communicate his strength, passion, and commitment. Intense and intuitive, he is a force to be reckoned with. Through much work and experience he has mastered his emotions and is able to balance his aware heart with the power of his mind. When the Governor of Cups appears in your Tarot reading, dig deep and seek to truly understand what is going on within you. Do not avoid your feelings; lean into them and work through them -- rewards lie on the other side.

•Ace of Swords:



The Ace of Swords represents your prime motive or guiding ideal; the vision that guides you. It is an optimistic symbol of evolution, progress, hope, and victory. This card may arise when you're at the beginning of a new endeavor -- often having left something else behind -- and in need of additional clarity or fortitude to move forward. The Ace of Swords provides the message that you have the strength you need to handle anything that lies before you.

•Two of Swords:



The Two of Swords is a card of decision-making. It represents conflicting ideas which must be reconciled to arrive at a harmonious place. When the Two of Swords arises in your Tarot reading, you could be dealing with many mixed signals and misunderstandings, leaving you unsure which path to take. To remove yourself from this state of limbo, the Two of Swords urges you to gain as much information as you can, so you can consider it all and make the best decision for your future.

•Three of Swords:



The Three of Swords is one of the most recognizable cards in a Tarot deck. This is a card of heartache, separation, and sorrow. While this card's appearance in your Tarot reading could be warning you of impending sadness, this card often arises when you are already in a state of grief. The Three of Swords, while painful, encourages you to lean into this pain, to truly experience and understand it. By moving through your emotions, rather than avoiding them, you give yourself the gift of strength, truth, healing, and growth.

• Four of Swords:



The Four of Swords urges you to take some time out and retreat to a place of rest and serenity. If you move forward without taking time to wind down or process what you're going through, you'll reach a state of total emotional and physical burn-out. When the Four of Swords comes up in your Tarot reading, you need a break. You will move forward stronger, more complete, and more capable if you allow yourself time to stop now and contemplate where you've been, and where you're going.

•The Governess of Swords:



The Governess of Swords knows what she wants. She is smart, honest, self-sufficient, and independent. She is not a conformer and is too wise to be confined to traditional roles. When the Governess of Swords arises in your Tarot reading, it's a message to act with independence and to fight for yourself. Never let anyone mold you into something different -- be strong and stand up for all that you are.

•The Governor of Swords:




The Governor of Swords is a force of wisdom. He does not carry an emotional air -- his strength lies in the mind, in intelligence, truth, and fairness. He has gained his knowledge through much experience, and approaches life in an objective way that garners respect from those around him. While the Governor of Swords can seem cool or detached, he is here to offer great support. When this card comes up in your Tarot reading, you may be in the position of lending guidance to others or could benefit from asking for advice yourself. When you seek guidance from the King of Swords, you can expect nothing but the truth.

Ace of Pentacles:



The Ace of Pentacles is usually pictured with a garden or agricultural backdrop to emphasize its connection to Earth, and the potential of this Ace to serve as a seed of future fulfillment. If your talents are planted and tended carefully, this seed will sprout and reward you with a good harvest. The Ace represents the first step to your goal, but if that step is repeated, it can cover great distances. When the Ace of Pentacles arises in your Tarot reading, it is a message of support, and advises that you move gradually, steadily, and with intention in order to reach your long-term goals.

•Two of Pentacles:



The Two of Pentacles generally features a figure juggling, with two Pentacles flying about him in figure-eight fashion. It is clear that until one or the other Pentacle drops, the final call cannot be made; there is more to learn before an action can be taken. Therefore, the Two of Pentacles counsels patience, so do not allow circumstances to hustle you. You have all the time you need to work this out, no matter how urgent things appear right now. When the Two of Pentacles comes up in your Tarot reading, changes are in the works, but you will do better to stay calm until you have more information. Everything is in flux.

•Three of Pentacles:



The Three of Pentacles is traditionally the Tarot card of genius. It often depicts a master craftsman consulting with his colleagues on how to complete a masterwork. On occasion, the genius is portrayed at his studio, alone and burning the midnight oil in a creative ferment. When the Three of Pentacles arises in your Tarot reading, it is a message to enjoy what you do, and to stay focused on the task at hand. Through realistic plans, collaboration, and a dedication to improvement, you can turn your great visions into realities

•Four of Pentacles:



The Four of Pentacles represents the paradox of material security - the double-edged reality that comes when you have been well supported and protected, yet this prosperity brings the pressure of big decisions and responsibilities. This card urges you to adopt skills to sensibly handle your finances and your environment, and to not be daunted by surprise developments. When this Tarot card arises in your reading, it is a message to make sound judgements -- do not waste, but do not cling, either. Disconnect your self-worth from your material worth. You may be holding on too tightly, trying desperately to maintain control, and would benefit by loosening your attachment to your finances and other materialistic concerns; these are not the ways to true contentment.

•The Governess of Pentacles:



The Governess of Pentacles is endowed with enormous, good sense and problem-solving energy. She loves to advise, encourage, nurture, and empower those she gets involved with, helping to solve their difficulties. She is an educator and a healer, and is happiest when sharing her time, energy, skills, and money with others. If the Governess of Pentacles comes up in your Tarot reading, give of yourself, and focus on creating a comfortable, rich environment for yourself and your loved ones. Practice grounding and compassion and/or seek advice from someone in your life who exhibits these qualities.

•The Governor of Pentacles:



The King of Pentacles is someone who has accomplished a lot in life, and he has much to show for it. He's a builder, a succeeder, and a high-roller. He has great financial power and garners much respect. The King of Pentacles has reached the top of the ladder, and has matured not only his profits but his personal values as well. In a Tarot reading, this King represents attainment and completion of long-term goals. It reminds you to work methodically, and take the strongest, most reliable path to get where you're trying to go. And when you get there, try going even further.


