The Lovers: Symbolizes love, harmony, and choices. It represents relationships and the balance between opposing forces.




### The Chariot:

Queen of Wands: Symbolizes confidence, warmth, and determination. It represents a charismatic leader and the power of attraction.




### King of Wands:

Three of Cups: Symbolizes celebration, friendship, and community. It represents joy and shared experiences with loved ones.




### Four of Cups:

Eight of Swords: Represents restriction, confusion, and feeling trapped. It signifies self-imposed limitations and the need for liberation.




### Nine of Swords:

Nine of Swords: Symbolizes anxiety, worry, and sleepless nights. It represents mental anguish and the need to confront fears.




### Ten of Swords:

Six of Pentacles: Represents generosity, sharing, and charity. It signifies the balance of giving and receiving help.




### Seven of Pentacles:

Ten of Pentacles: Represents legacy, family, and long-term success. It signifies wealth and stability passed down through generations.




