## New Water/Sewer Shut-Off Policy Effective Jan 1st.

December 31st is just ahead and with it the new policy on non-payment of water/sewer bills. For several months we have posted reminders to get past due accounts caught up. Any account currently past due will be receiving another letter with the water bill about the shut off policy effective with the new year. Tuesday, January 3rd past due accounts will be shut off, and will remain off until the account is paid in full including the TURN off and TURN on fee of \$70. NO extensions and NO payment arrangements. Properties that don't pay water/sewer past due bills are subject to tax sale.

The Council will review bids received for construction of Nace's Park. A draft ordinance on chickens, farm and exotic animals in residential districts will be up for consideration of introduction.
