- Review your emergency action plans. Know what actions you will take during a power outage or winter storm
- Identify a safe alternate location for personnel in case of an extended outage
- Test your equipment. If you have a generator, you should test it regularly
- Protect critical or sensitive electronic equipment with an uninterruptible power supply (UPS) for temporary backup power
- Plan a manual backup for work done on computers
- Ensure electronic door locks can be bypassed manually
- If you have an emergency lighting system, make sure it's in good working order

If a severe storm hits, monitor local weather reports regularly and follow the advice of local emergency management officials.
