You are invited to attend a very important public information session on **Thursday, January 19, 2017** at 7 pm at Town Hall to learn about the Town's financial state and the reasons behind the decisions that the Town Council will be making in the near future regarding

water and sewer rates, real property taxes and infrastructure projects. Along with the Town Council, also in attendance will be the Town's Attorney, the Town's Financial Auditor and the Town's Engineer to answer any questions. A public hearing will be held on January 4, 2017 on Ordinance 14-2016 that was introduced on December 7th. This ordinance, if adopted, allows the keeping of no more than 4 chickens but not roosters or crowing hens, in residential districts by special exception with certain requirements for lot size, setbacks & containment. The ordinance also regulates the keeping of farm and exotic animals. The hearing will begin at 6:45 p.m. The full ordinance is available on line or in the town office or by emailing the Town Clerk, Clerk@trappemd.net
