**Town Meetings and Planning Commission Meetings are open to the public.** Citizens are encouraged to attend to be informed and give input. Meeting agendas are posted outside Town Hall every Friday, and items are added as requested (which can be as late as Wednesday morning) and re-posted with each change. An early agenda is posted on the Town website, but may not always include the latest changes. Stop by the Town Hall on Wednesday evenings and learn first-hand about the many happenings in our town. In making sure that you do so the Town receives their portion of income taxes and it doesn't all go to the County. As you can imagine this is very important for the Town so we can continue to provide the services that we offer now and improve in areas that need improvement. If you have any questions on how to make sure this is done correctly please ask your tax expert. Thank you.

## Sheriff Joe Gamble speaker at Community Dinner

Roughly forty people gathered in late February at the firehouse to hear Talbot County Sheriff Joe Gamble. Following a pot luck supper Sheriff Gamble spoke on the presence of Heroin in Talbot County-how it gets here, how users get started, services available to those with an addiction, and efforts being made by the Sheriff's department to address the epidemic. Gamble reminded the group that addiction impacts all of us-it is a community problem, and it is going to take everyone's involvement to turn the tide. Gamble said parents, neighbors, relatives need to be vigilant about locking up prescription painkillers, and should openly discuss the dangers of addiction with their children and grandchildren at an early age. If you hear or know that someone's child may be using drugs make that difficult call to the parent-they may be unaware, and need our support. Help is available for those with addiction issues by calling 410-819-5688 thru the Talbot County Health Department. The Sheriff's office is distributing cards with this information to everyone they arrest for drugs, and to families who request assistance for their loved ones. The discussion with Sheriff Gamble and dinner were arranged by Julie Libby with assistance from the Trappe Community Outreach Team-an all volunteer group of Trappe residents. 

Water bills are to be paid by the due date either in person, by mail or via on line banking. Watch the due date-it varies each month. Town staff do not accept payments anywhere but the town office. *Credit card payment* now offered for a small fee. Council and Planning Commission meetings are open to the public and residents are encouraged to attend. Faxing, copying, notary services are available at the town office during regular office hours for a small fee.

Water bills are due on March 21st. Next meter reading will be March 23 & 24. The town office accepts credit card payments. There is a service fee of \$3 to \$5 depending on the charge being paid for with the credit card.

The Office will be closed Friday, March 25th Good Friday. Don't forget the town office & wwtp have new phone & fax numbers! On Holidays and after hours the new phone system will connect you with the water treatment plant on call employee by pressing 1 FOR EMERGENCIES ONLY!



The Town Council has decided to purchase lawn mowers and other lawn care equipment and take over the responsibility of mowing the Town's properties instead of sub-contracting out the work. This is yet another place the Town Council has been able to cut costs and save money while still providing excellent services.

Correction to last month's INDEX. ONLY those sidewalks in front of town owned parks, and buildings are cleared by contractors and/or staff during snow /ice events. Property owners are responsible for clearing sidewalks at their homes and businesses of all obstructions. # **Rehab loan assistance for Owner Occupied Dwellings**

The State of Maryland Dept of Housing & Community Development (DHCD) offers low interest and 0 interest loans, and deferred loans to individuals for repairs, and accessibility modifications to owner occupied homes. Program is designed to provide assistance to those who meet income qualifications and live in single family homes. Program is not open for commercial or rental units. Typical repairs may include plumbing, roof, windows, lead paint abatement, ramps, heating system replacement, and a variety of other items. Applicants will have a home inspection with a rehab specialist to determine the necessary repairs. 




### **POLICE CHIEF'S CORNER**
