
The office will be closed Monday, May 30th MEMORIAL DAY.

Water bills are to be paid by the due date either in person, by mail or via on line banking. Watch the due date-it varies each month. Faxing, copying, notary services are available at the town office during regular office hours for a small fee. Please call the office first if you need a large quantity of copies or customization of copies.

The town office accepts credit card payments.

There is a service fee of \$3 to \$5 depending on the charge being paid for with the credit card.

On Holidays and after hours the new phone system will connect you with the water treatment plant on call employee by pressing 1 FOR EMERGENCIES ONLY! Water shut-off for non-payment is NOT an emergency. Water will be turned on during normal business hours after payment is made at the office. Town staff do not accept payments anywhere but the town office.

### WALK SMART

- Stay alert, avoid distractions while walking and always watch for cars!
- Look left-right, then left again. When the road is clear, begin crossing & look for turning vehicles.
- Cross at marked cross walks. Always obey traffic signals and signs. Cross at the nearest intersection.
- Make eye contact with drivers to be sure they see you.
- Wear light colored or reflective clothing to be more visible at night.

### RT 565 SIDEWALK UPDATE

At the April 6th Council meeting the Council voted to select option #2 (Closed System) sidewalk design for the area along RT 565 (Old Trappe Road). A closed sidewalk system puts the sidewalk and curb next to the paved road similar to the sidewalk further down the street towards the center of town. Storm drain is run under the sidewalk to eliminate the large open ditches that presently exist. Commissioners Norm Fegel and Don English, and staff traveled to Chestertown to attend a design progress meeting on April 13th with State Highway staff. Additional analysis of utility relo-I cation costs, and stormwater impacts is needed before State Highway makes a final design determination. The overall cost of the project, and what, if any, contribution is needed from the town for right of ways will be a key factor in the final design.

Town officials stressed to State Highway the safety concern that the lack of sidewalks between White Marsh Elementary School and Home Run Baker park creates. Plans are available for viewing at the town office during normal business hours. The pubic is encouraged to stop by and take a look.



**Spark In Da Pan** is a steel drum ensemble based out of Easton, MD. The group is comprised of veteran panplayers, who formerly played for The High Groove Steelers. This high school group was originated and directed by Greg Sparks, from 1996 to 2003 through Easton High School.

Members of the high school group came together years later, following a sensational surprise reunion concert of The High Groove Steelers, in dedication to Greg "Sparky" Sparks. Aptly naming themselves "Spark in Da Pan", the group was officially formed in August 2014.

The music that is performed is inspired from various musical genres such as calypso, soca, reggae, pop, and traditional panorama. The band got its start with just three sets of steel drums and a drum set. The band has continued to grow through additional colorful instrumentation, with the goal of having a full orchestral ensemble.

You'll find that the songs are not simply thrown together to sound like a play-along session. In reality, they are carefully arranged in an effort to seamlessly stitch together the melodies, harmonies, and the vibrant sounds that only the steel pan has to offer.

You may remember that our slogan is "Building Our Future by Preserving Our Past". Back in the days of World War II nearly every home in Trappe had a garden in their backyard. In the early 1940's these gardens were known as "Victory Gardens" and provided much of the food our families ate as supplies in the stores were limited.



### TIPS ABOUT YOUR CELL PHONE: FIRST (Emergency)

The Emergency Number worldwide for Mobile is 112. If you find yourself out of the coverage area of your mobile network and there is an Emergency, dial 112 and the mobile will search any existing network to establish the emergency number for you, and interestingly, this number 112 can be dialed even if the keypad is locked. Try it out.

### **SECOND** (Hidden Battery Power)

Imagine your cell battery is very low. To activate, press the keys \*3370#. Your cell phone will restart with this reserve and the instrument will show a 50% increase in battery. This reserve will get charged when you charge your cell phone next time. *More tips next month.*
