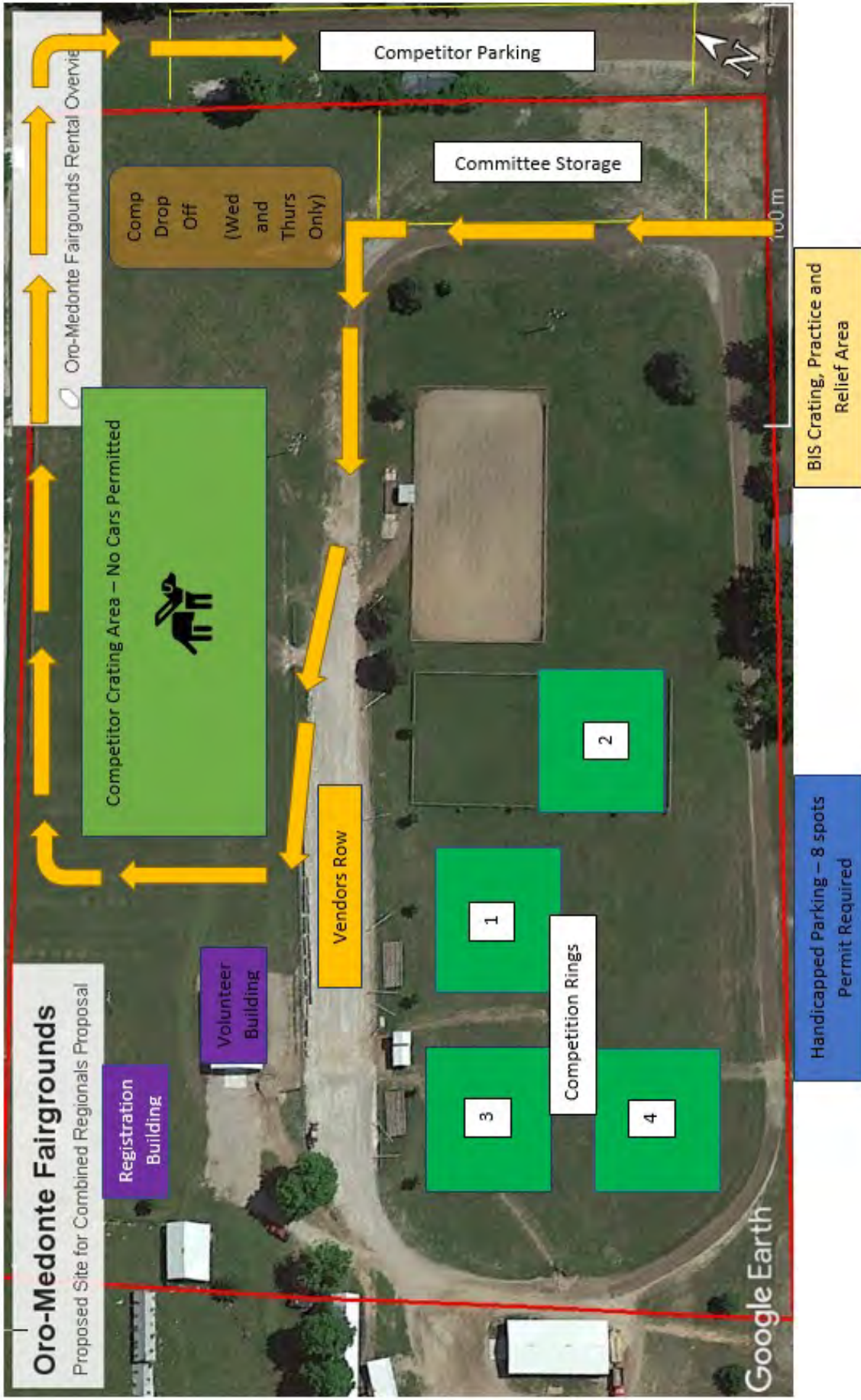
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Site Rules

In order to make everyone's visit a safe and enjoyable one, we have just a few rules:

1. PLEASE drive slowly everywhere in the Oro Fairgrounds. Vehicle access to your tents will only be permitted Wednesday after 12:00pm, Thursday all day and Sunday after the final Regional run is completed. **THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.**
2. Morning shuttles to your shade tents will be provided by our golf carts. Service is reserved for competitors that really need this.
3. Vendors will be allowed access to their locations by vehicle before 8:30am. We ask that all vendors have their vehicles parked before 8:30AM in the parking lot. Please be aware of spacing to allow room for cars to pass when unpacking.
4. Competitors/Volunteers may only park in the area designated on the site map. Vendors are permitted to park in the committee storage area as marked in the site map.
5. Tents must be lowered at the end of the day. Sporadic security checks will be made throughout the evening and gates closed at night. With that in mind as hosts we are not responsible for misplaced items or damaged items due to weather.
6. Dogs must be on leash at all times except when competing in the ring. No exceptions.
7. Not all dogs love other dogs. Please keep your dog under control and out of other dogs' faces, even if your dog is not dog aggressive.
8. Please pick up your dog's waste. If you see a stray poop, please pick it up as it reflects poorly on our group.
9. Please clean up after yourself. There are waste containers for your trash. Please take all large items back home with you.
10. Please do your best to keep barking anywhere outside an active agility ring to a minimum.
11. Be nice to our judges and ring crew. Remember if you want to be treated with respect, give others the same respect. Our volunteers are here so you can run your dog; please take a moment to thank at least one volunteer a day.
12. Please post kind, inspiring and respectful things on social media! We have the power to inspire another generation of dog enthusiasts and a new group that will host future competitions. Use that power wisely.
13. Last but not least, have fun! Remember we enter the ring as friends and leave the ring as friends!

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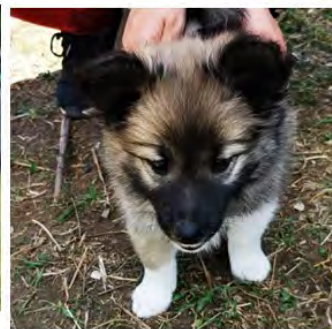
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BIS Rules

Bitches in season (BIS) will be allowed to compete at all 2024 Regional and Nationals events.

The host's premium must state clearly that BIS are allowed to compete, and the specific rules and regulations pertaining to BIS and any additional requirements deemed reasonable by the host.

Requirements for BIS at AAC Regional and National Events:

The following conditions will apply and must be clearly stated in the club premium:

1. Handlers are required to notify the trial secretary that they will be running a BIS at the event as soon as it is known.
2. It must be stated in the club premium that handlers should minimize exposure of their BIS to other dogs and limit their movements about the grounds.
3. Competitors with dogs that come into season will be allowed to withdraw and will be offered a refund if they choose not to compete.
4. Competitors will be notified there is a BIS on site.
5. A protective mat shall be used at the start line. The host will provide the mat for all BIS to use on the start line. (Minimum of a 2'x3' mat of non-slip material)
6. BIS will be required to run in protective panties. If panties happen to come off in the middle of the run, there will be no fault.
7. BIS will run as a group at the end of each class.
8. "BIS" will be noted next to the dog's name on the gate sheet so that other competitors, ring crew and the Judge(s) are aware.
9. BIS must use a designated relief area.
10. BIS must wear protective panties when not within the designated relief area.

BIS must be allowed to compete at any events, whether sanctioned titling classes or non-sanctioned runs, held in conjunction with Regionals and Nationals on the same site.

BIS fees added on to competitor's registration:

Any competitor who will be running with a BIS is responsible to pay the \$50 administrative change fee as well as a \$50 operational fee – in total, \$100 per BIS (fee payable once for the whole event, not per day).

This fee is to cover:

1. The administrative cost of making changes to running orders and printing after May 6th as listed on the premium. (The same fee applies to any competitor, this is not exclusive to BIS.)
 2. The operational cost placed on the host/facility including separate area for crating/relief, cleaning supplies, required matting, maintenance, and additional volunteer to ensure those who are participating with BIS follow the rules so that any complaints may be mitigated.
- Anyone who's dog comes into season (BIS) and wishes to withdraw may do so as per the rules stated in the premium. A veterinary note is required and a refund will be provided.

NOTE: All competitors should bank on the fact that BIS will be in attendance. No refund will be given for those not wanting to participate if a BIS is present. You are being made aware now that they will be permitted to participate and you should expect them to be onsite.

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Warm Up Run Rules

Warm up runs will be held on Thursday. Each team has two minutes in the ring your time starts when you enter the ring. Food and toys are being allowed under the following conditions: Toys must be in a good state of repair and may not contain audible squeakers or other noise makers. **Treats must be kept on the handler in a manner that prevents food from falling when running and food must be given directly to the dog. Please no crumble treats in the warm up rings.** Training aids (e.g. Clickers, stride regulators, target plates) are not allowed.
