HCFP was approached in regards to offering a food table at the recent Mother Bird Fair. It appealed to us as we would be the only vendors! Thanks to Karen and Wendell Cummings, and several of the cooks and volunteers at the pantry, we made nearly \$900 for the pantry. This brought about an interesting conversation about HCFP funding. Apparently several are under the impression that the food is simply donated to our pantry. We want to get the word out that the Homer Pantry spends nearly \$15,000 a month and roughly \$180,000 annually! We have 3 grant writers on the board but are always seeking out contributors. We serve 167 families and more are signing up weekly. We also serve numerous Vets. Our In Kind Services of helping people with expenses other than food needs was cut down to \$200 a year per family. We have people dedicated each week to helping folks find other resources available to them. Someone mentioned that we are always posting the money amounts that are gifted to the pantry so they thought we were flush with funding. Far from it! With the new regs on illegal moose hunting and the poor fishing haul last year, & inflation, our supplies have diminished greatly. We have tried to help more through our Community Free Fridge that is open 24/7 and replenished daily. That too has increased costs as well as the time devoted to serving those in need in Homer.
