Also on the list was improved lighting inside the atrium and

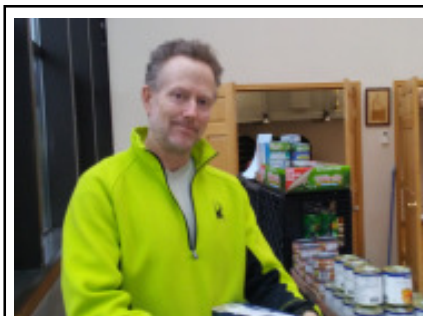
other Food Pantry entry points.
