David Kaughman, Paul Dugan, Xochitl Harbison, Jenna Gerrety, Marie Herdgen, Annette Bellamy, Jeff Scalzi, Anna Iredale, Maygen Lotsher, Valissa Higman, and the Homer High School made this possible and it was a sell out! HCOA provided the space for some of the potters and the Homer Rotary donated \$300 towards the clay.
