The first check was for \$5,022.06 for their 'nickel a gallon' fundraising promotion

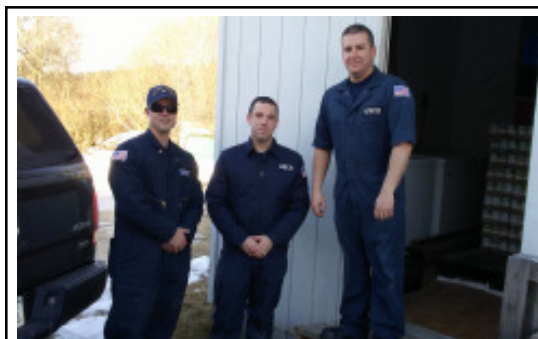
held from November 15th through December 15th of last year.
