r very Monday, the Homer -Food Pantry takes in an enormous number of cardboard boxes, plastic wrapping and a variety of storage and packaging materials. Where does it go?

Ask our Master of Recycling and Reusing, Vicki Rentmeester. She is our resident expert on all things recyclable and reusable.

Her team breaks down the cardboard boxes and transports them to the recycling center at Save-U-More. All recyclable plastic also finds its way to the proper recycling location.

We also receive many small plastic bottles, large containers and 'yogurt sized" containers. Vicki assures reusable items are washed, rinsed, sanitized and dried so other volunteers can use them for syrup, laundry soap, flour and even spaghetti sauce prepared by the kitchen staff. As you can see, literally nothing goes to waste.
