Food Pantry Board Votes To Re-Open To Shopping.

At the August 25th meeting of the Homer Community Food Pantry Board of Directors, the opening of the Food Pantry to indoor shopping by clients was approved and will take effect on September 28th.


Hours of service will be reduced from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. to Noon to 3 p.m. effective September 7th. Delivery of food boxes will cease after September 14th. However, those clients who are elderly, disabled or unable to either visit the Food Pantry or pick up a box from the drive-through will be permitted to continue with home delivery. It is requested that they re-apply through the provider who originally requested service.

In-house shopping will require

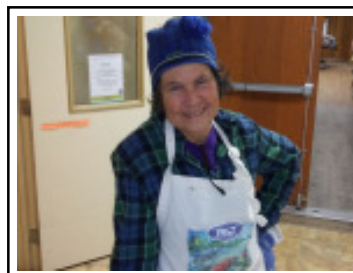
adherence to several criteria. This includes wearing a mask, only a few may enter the Food Pantry at a time to maintain social distancing, a limited amount of time provided to select food items, and allowing staff to place produce you select in bags for you.

For clients who do not feel comfortable entering the building, a limited number of prepacked boxes will be available for drive-through service.

Non-food services will still be provided at the exit on the west side (atrium side) double doors.

Together, with everyone's complete cooperation, the Food Pantry will make every attempt to return to as normal an experience as possible.
