There is a difference between a food pantry...and a food bank.

A food bank provides distribution of food items to food pantries and other non-profit food service agencies.

A food pantry provides direct distribution of food items to clients in their area. Their resources include the food bank and other direct donations.

Every year, on the second Saturday of May, the National Association of Letter Carriers joins in partnership with Food Banks and Food Pantries throughout the U.S. It's called the Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive and has collected over one billion pounds of food over the past 25 years.

They make it very easy for everyone to donate non-perishable items by simply requesting you leave the items next to your mailbox. The mail carriers pick them up and bring them back to the postal service distribution center. From there, they are all delivered to the local food pantry or food bank in their service area.

This year was no exception. As you can see in the photo above, volunteer and board member, Bill Wells has taken delivery of several wagon loads of a variety of wonderful food items from this extremely productive one-day event.
