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

The meeting was called to order by President Conover at 6:50 Pm Tuesday, November 26, 2013. The Invocation was given by Chaplin Gene Myers, the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Sam Bradley and the SAR pledge was led by Chuck Smith. There were six members who attended the meeting. The only guest at the meeting was LAUX member Joy Krahn.

The minutes as they appeared in the November Dispatch were approved by the members in attendance.

Reports;

Secretary Tom Douglas's report consisted of a review of the October meeting held at the Cold Springs Country Club and our third annual Community Service Awards Program. There was some discussion but the overall feelings were the program was a complete success. During the discussion Secretary Douglas commented on the two



members of the Gold Country Chapter members who came to the meeting to help with the Color Guard. It was approved that the Secretary would send Dale Ross and Gordon Clark of the Gold Country Chapter and Tom Chilton of the Sacramento Chapter certificates of appreciation for their participation in the program. There was some discussion on the date of the CSA. The members in attendance voted on a motion by Sam Bradley and seconded by Chuck Smith that we keep the program in the month of October. Therefore the date of the program in 2014 will be October 28, 2014. John Krahn made a motion to change the December meeting from December 24th (Christmas Eve) to December 17th. That motion was seconded and passed. Tom Douglas brought up the subject of adding a Recording Secretary to the list of officers for the chapter. The addition of a Recording Secretary would help spread the work load to more members of the chapter. The addition was thought to be a good idea but could not be voted on until the December meeting. Secretary Douglas was to email the by-law changes to the membership for a December vote. Secretary Douglas agreed to find a good scheduling calendar so the chapter could better schedule our annual events so as not to conflict with one another. Secretary Douglas was asked to send to the Historian, John Krahn a copy of the CSP program for the history file. Secretary Douglas agreed to put the chapter meeting dates in "The Clipper" a local advertising magazine and try to get the Mountain Democrat to print a picture and short article of the Community Service Dinner in a near future issue.

Treasurer Tom Douglas reported a checking account balance of \$2,337.

Registrar, Historian and Youth Activities Coordinator did not have reports.

Tom Douglas agreed to be the Dispatch Editor. He is taking over before year end because Tom Chilton who has been publishing the newsletter is having surgery in November. It was noted that Compatriot Chilton has done much for the chapter, including editing the Dispatch.

The next order of business was the nominating and election of officers for the 2014 calendar year. The following members were nominated and because there was only one member nominated for each office, upon their acceptance of the nomination, the membership elected each to the particular office.

The offices of Registrar and 1st and 2nd Vice President were not filled at this meeting.
